## **SAFETY AND SUPERVISION - IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

## In order to keep your child and every child safe in our school I ask that you support us in adhering to the following expectations.

At Corpus Christi staff are on duty in the playground from 8:15am to 8:45am each morning Monday to Friday. No child is to be at school prior to this time. If care is required before 8:15am please contact representatives at our Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) Program on 8742 6593 to organise Before School Care.

At 8:15am children need to wait at the entrance doors to the office until a supervising staff member begins duty. At this time children from Grades 3-6, only, are allowed on the Senior playground. Children in Grades P-2 are able to use the Junior playground.

For safety reasons no child is allowed on the SENIOR PLAYGROUND after school without direct supervision of parents or carers. (There is no teacher on duty in the playground near the Adventure Playgrounds after school, as they are covering many other areas.)

Toddlers / pre-schoolers may use the JUNIOR PLAYGROUND with

direct supervision of parents at all times.

**SCHOOL UNIFORM** Please note that the changeover period for uniform finishes on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> November. Children are expected to be in summer uniform from <u>Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> November 2018</u>.



Beginning an investigation into the reading comprehension strategy of 'bias and prejudice' to assist us to better understand intended message across a text during Literacy.

Over the next few weeks, we look forward to the Book Week Parade and Activities, exploring further how the states of matter (solids, liquids, gas) change and enhancing our oral presentation skills & active listening skills as presenters and members of an audience.

# **Learning & Teaching News**



Before we know it, the end of the school year will be with us. Term four is a full term with lots of social and learning activities happening in all year levels. It is a term that can be hard on everyone; as the end of the year nears students become tired and restless and not as engaged in learning as they could be knowing they will be in a new community/year level next year.

We need to remind and encourage students to keep a positive mindset and continue to put all their effort into their learning as some new learning is also introduced during term Four and past learning needs to be consolidated to ensure success in the future.

Routines at this time of year become really important to allow students to approach their learning positively with all that might be happening at home and at school. Eg family celebrations, preparation for holidays away, Christmas, school events

- Keeping bedtimes as normal as possible during the week as well as preparing a substantial breakfast helps them get up with enough energy to start the day
- Healthy snacks in the lunchbox help the energy levels during the day Loading the lunchbox with lots of sugar gives instant energy but a short burst only and often students become more tired than before they ate
- Often students don't want to eat large quantities when it's warmer so smaller sized sandwiches or more snacks can be a better option
- As the weather becomes warmer students need to be reminded to drink more water and therefore keep their water bottle filled and drink small amounts frequently
- Encouragement to be their best during the school day and giving time to discussing their day when they need it, lets students know you are interested in what they want to tell you about their day
- Often students don't really respond to the question *What did you do today?* Instead ask: Tell me about the best learning you did today?
- Illnesses can occur more often when students are tired , so if your child says they feel unwell please keep them at home to recover even if its that they only need a good sleep!

Finally reassure students that the coming year will be a new adventure for them and know that we at Corpus Christi will guide the students through a process to help them transition to next year positively. With families' support this transition will help all students in the future to settle successfully into their new 2019 community.

The question for the students to solve is:

#### **Foundation-2 question**:

If I received \$2 each day for a week, how much money would I have? How could you record this as a number sentence? Make sure you show your working out in an efficient way.

#### Grade 3-6 question:

If I received \$5.70 each day for a fortnight, how much money would I have? How could you record this as a number sentence? Make sure you show your working out in an efficient way.
