

Learning & Teaching News

For the Love of Literature!



We know as parents and educators that it is vitally important for all children to be able to read and understand what they are reading...above all we want students to love reading and enjoy different types of literature! We can't make children love reading but we can help them find success in reading which in return will help them like it a bit more!

At Corpus Christi students are exposed to a wide range of literature that are used for different purposes but most importantly read for enjoyment. Teachers lead students to understand these texts by immersing them not only in the spelling grammar and punctuation used but also the elements in the text that the writer has used to engage their audience. Understanding this at all age levels is important and also supports children's writing. When reading or being read to, children are viewing and hearing good models of written texts which help them with ways of writing their own texts.

At times children will have to read or listen to books or subject area texts that they are not entirely interested in but they need to know that at times, if we want to learn about lots of different subjects, we need to read these!

Our Victorian Curriculum states: English

Texts are chosen because they are judged to have the potential for enriching the lives of students, expanding the scope of their experience and because they represent effective and interesting features of form and style. Learning to appreciate literary texts and to create their own literary texts enriches students' understanding of human experiences and the capacity for language to deepen those experiences. It builds students' knowledge about how language can be used for aesthetic ends, to create particular emotional, intellectual or philosophical effects. Students interpret, appreciate, evaluate and create literary texts such as short stories, novels, poetry, prose, plays, film and multimodal texts, in spoken, print and digital/online forms

Selection of Good Fit Books

It is so important for children to read books that interest them, but it is also important that the books they choose match their reading level. Books that are too hard will frustrate them and make reading difficult, and books that are too easy are boring and interest will be lost.

There are some simple ways that you can help your children select a good fit book.

If they choose a book that is too hard, read it to them or with them linking the words to any diagrams, pictures or photos. When people read books that are too hard for them, they often skip important parts. Children will have more fun with a harder book if they are encouraged to wait until they can read it more easily.





We have many Australian authors who I would recommend to parents that not only engage the children but also help them learn about our multicultural and historical past and present.

MOBILE PHONES, IPAD OR TABLETS

Online gaming

Most people enjoy playing games, so it is no surprise that video and online games are very popular with adults and children. Online games offer connections similar to those offered by the old-fashioned offline games, such as interaction with other players. Many people find them relaxing, and regard playing games not only as a great way to chill out, but also to connect with family and friends.

Here are some suggestions if your children play online games, particularly on sites that allow them to interact directly with others:

- supervise your children's interactions
- establish rules for your children to follow so that they know:
- what to do if they receive disturbing content or contact from others
- what information they are allowed to give others
- show an interest in your child's gaming, without judgement
- encourage your children to talk to you if somebody seems too interested in them

17% experienced bullying or abuse while playing a network game with others

34% made an in-game purchase and this rose to 45% when they played a network game with others.

Numeracy News

Thank you to the parents that have spoken to me so far and have asked questions on how they can assist their child's learning in numeracy at home. If you have any questions, please come and see me and I am happy to answer any of the questions that you may have.

Please continue to promote and use the language of 'Growth Mindset' with your child. If you hear your child say, "I'm just not good at this," encourage them to think and say, "I need to try another strategy" or "I will try and use a strategy that we have been working on at school." Always encourage your child to use the most efficient strategy that works for them.

If you hear your child get upset because they made a mistake, encourage them to think and say, "That's ok, mistakes help me learn better."

Below are some useful apps and websites that you can encourage your child to use at home. Good apps and websites need to give feedback or tips/hints. Make sure that your child focuses on tasks that they are currently learning at school. This will give them more confidence with their learning at school. FOUNDATION UNIT

It is amazing to think we are at the half way mark of term 1 already! !! The children continue to impress us with their enthusiasm, humour and 'have a go' attitude, they are really creating an energetic buzzzzzz in Yellow Community.

Our upcoming literacy units will be focussing on the development of oral language skills including description and the way we transfer this to reading and writing. At home take this opportunity to deepen your child's language and vocabulary by encouraging full sentences during conversations, prompting them to include describing words.

In Numeracy we will be learning about the language of location. Students will be undertaking activities that will develop an understanding of positioning, for example; above, on, under, in, next to and through. You can use this language at home through incidental conversations like "put your shoes next to the door" or "unpack your bag on the bench".

In Religion the children will listen to and reflect on stories about Jesus and his friends the Disciples. They will also explore what makes a good friend and ways they can be a good friend.

MIDDLE UNIT

In Numeracy, Middle students will be collecting, graphing and analysing a range of data from around the school to connect back to our Inquiry - Safety and Rules. Students have been working on 'School Rules and Responsibilities' and how their choices affect them and others around them. They have also been looking at safety in their home environment which they will then use to create 'Safety Posters' for our community.

For Literacy, students have been exploring narratives and developing a deeper understanding of what makes an engaging story. We have explored sizzling starters and the use of grammar to make a narrative more entertaining. In Religion, students are currently involved in preparations for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and will analyse the Four Stages of Reconciliation as: Admit, Say Sorry, Be Forgiven and Make Up. Students will connect to times of forgiveness and healing in their lives and what this can look, feel and sound like through the story of The Prodigal Son.

The Middle Community will again be utilising the Remind app. to inform our Middle Community parents about student learning, reminders, exciting activities and goings on in the Middles. The password to access the Middle Community is: **middles18**

JUNIOR UNIT

We are pleased to see students becoming familiar with new routines and gradually developing their independent skills. We are amazed at how many kids now walk into school alone and carry their own communication bags!

This week students have been consolidating our workshop standards of: entering and maintaining appropriate noise level in workshops, getting materials straight away, building stamina, remaining in one spot to work the whole time and packing up materials promptly. In Writing, the Juniors have been looking at procedural texts. This is a great opportunity to get the recipe books out or instructional manuals around the house to immerse students in procedural texts (step by step instructions).

In Numeracy, the Juniors have been exploring place value and making representations with icy pole sticks (bundles) and MAB blocks. In Inquiry we have looked at the healthy and unhealthy foods we put in our bodies.

Next week, the Juniors will continue to look at number reading, writing, ordering and making numbers. We also will be exploring location and following directions e.g left, right, over, under, quarter turn etc. Students will have their specialist day on Friday, therefore wear sports uniform on **Friday the 16th March**.


Restorative Practice at Corpus Christi PS

Our school rules are:

- Follow instructions
- Listen to the speaker
- Speak appropriately
- Keep hands, feet and objects to yourself
- Move and play safely at all times
- Take care of our property and the environment

Our social expectations are:

- We work well and allow others to do the same.
- We respect each other through speech and manner.
- We resolve problems in a calm, sensible, respectful and fair way.
- We use inside voices inside.
- We move calmly and safely inside and outside.
- We take pride in our environment and ourselves.



These expectations are displayed throughout the school. Over the past few weeks, students have been looking at school rules and responsibilities and investigating the types of behaviours that ensure they present the best version of themselves. In times of peer conflict or poor behaviour choices, our school uses the philosophy of Restorative Practice.

What is Restorative Practice?

Restorative Practice encourages schools to shift their thinking from a traditional model of punishment for wrong-doers to one of education, accountability and meaningful change. We all deserve to feel safe and accepted and we all have the right to repair relationships and learn from our mistakes.

How does Restorative Practice work at Corpus Christi?

At Corpus Christi, we believe that every harm, poor choice or conflict is an opportunity for learning. If a student has had to leave the room due to unacceptable behaviour, the time missed will be paid back at break time where a conversation is had with a teacher and all parties involved. The purpose of the restorative conversation is to allow the student/s time to consider:

- What happened and what was my role in that?
- How did my behaviour affect others?
- What can I do to try and restore the relationship or repair the harm done?
- Moving forward, if this situation was to happen again, how could I respond differently?

Together with the teacher, students create a 'restorative action'- an action they partake to make things better. Together, they will discuss if a consequence is appropriate and what that may be. A 'Reflection Sheet' is sent home to inform parents of the incident and the discussion had.

The aim is to educate our students to be empathetic towards others, to take responsibility for their actions and develop skills to resolve issues fairly and confidently. Parent support is greatly appreciated.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
