We have our final Whole School Assembly on Monday 17th December at 2:05pm and our 'End of Year'' Liturgy at 9:00am on Tuesday 18th December with all children being dismissed at 1:00pm on this day. We look forward to celebrating all these occasions together with all of our families during these final weeks of 2018.

It is that time of year again when we farewell some staff members who are leaving us at the end of the year. We extend our gratitude and say goodbye to – Mrs Kim Gleeson and Miss McCabe Craig. Miss Craig has taken up a new challenge and position at another Catholic primary school in Altona and Mrs Gleeson is expecting her baby early in March 2019 and will take 12 months Maternity Leave. Kim plans to return to us in 2020. As Kim and McCabe end the year with us we thank them sincerely for their great contribution to the community of Corpus Christi School. They will certainly be missed.

WELCOME

It is also that time of year when we welcome to Corpus Christi new staff members who will be joining our community in 2019. Mr Jester Buslon and Mrs Kylie Jeffrie will join our team in 2019. We look forward to welcoming Jester and Kylie to Corpus Christi and I am confident that we will all help make them feel at home in no time at all.

ENROLMENTS 2019

We have had an enormous number of enrolment enquiries for Foundation in 2019. Most families who have applied are Catholic and within our zone or have siblings at our school, therefore making them all eligible at the highest level in terms of selection criteria for enrolment at Corpus Christi.

Therefore, the Leadership Team in consultation with the Consultative Committee have decided to have four Foundation groups next year. In preparation we have refurbished the current Library, Art Room, LOTE room and Playgroup space to accommodate 4 Home Groups which next year will be Foundation rooms. These Learning Communities will be called Yellow Learning Community and White Learning Community. As part of our Grounds Development Project (see information regarding this project further in this newsletter), we are building a verandah between both portables to extend our learning space. In addition, toilets will be installed at the end of the decking area for use by the children and staff working in the portables.

Home Groups for 2019 will consist of the following:

Foundation - 4 Home Groups - Yellow and White Learning Communities

Junior Unit - 4 Home Groups - Red and Aqua Learning Communities

Middle Unit - 5 Home Groups - Orange, Purple and Green Learning Community

Senior Unit - 5 Home Groups - Blue and Green Learning Community

GROUNDS AND LEARNING SPACES DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

The School Board members worked hard this year to begin the process of developing a 'School Grounds Development Master Plan" as a major project for 2017 - 2019.

Mrs Rosy Klyscz has been leading this development work and has supported the School Board in engaging with landscape designers and other professionals in this work. The School Board engaged the services of Daniel Cross from Cross Creations and Lukas Jess from PO Box Designs to support the development of a concept Design for the school.

As a result we now have a strategic plan for the project with many items that will be completed in 2018 and other items scheduled for the 2018 - 2019 Christmas holiday period and beyond.

Some of our completed work includes:

- Strategic staging of works identified
- Refurbishment of portables to accommodate 4 new home groups
- Additional Seating along the path to the car park
- Concrete paths to portables, including the relocation of a drain
- Replacing of 'Hot-House' plastic and additional improvements in the Community Garden

In addition, works yet to be completed include:

- A veranda between the Portables
- A veranda from the toilets to the MFR near the BBQ area
- Additional Toilets near the portables
- Rubber Rock to replace tan bark in the Senior Playground

In recent years, the number of families entitled to park in Disabled Parking bays has increased. To support these families we are exploring the possibility of creating an additional Disabled Parking bay alongside our current ones therefore we also plan to create an additional Disabled Carpark Bay and possibly include a "Seniors Only" Bay.

We are very excited about all these improvement and believe they will add considerable value to the learning and experiences we are able to provide to all in our community.

ORIENTATION DAY – MONDAY 10th December 2018

On Monday 10th December our children will meet their Learning Community teachers for 2019 and a note will go home that afternoon listing all communities, the name of their teachers and the name of the Learning Community colour for 2019.

An enormous amount of work has been put into class groupings for 2019. Staff have done a wonderful job, in partnership with parents, to consider all aspects of your children's development when determining Learning Community groupings for 2019.

As we move into 2019 please be assured of our commitment to delivering quality Catholic education to all at Corpus Christi.

We are looking forward to a wonderful 2019 school year.

Education in Faith

Week 1 of Advent, Hope

Dear Jesus, you are the hope in our messy world. This Advent, help us slow down, listen to your voice, and focus on what's really important. We place our hope in you as we prepare our hearts to celebrate your birth on Christmas. Amen.



ADVENT

The first Sunday of Advent is the 2nd of December. Advent is *not* "pre-Christmas," it's a separate, distinct, important liturgical season that deserves the same attention and reverence as Lent. Like Lent, it's a penitential season where we have yet another opportunity to recall, reflect, recollect, and reconcile. During Advent, we do this within the context of watchful waiting for the birth of Jesus, who is not yet our Christ.

We also have an opportunity to contemplate the vast meaning of Mary's "yes."

Our school will be focusing on this season by exploring units of work around Advent. Students will explore the special characters, events, symbols and stories around the infancy narratives. They will consider the importance of Advent and the story of Jesus' birth and they will also participate in Advent prayer sessions.

WHOLE SCHOOL MORNING PRAYER – A TIME FOR ALL TO STOP

During Advent, to help us be more mindful that we are journeying towards the birth of Jesus we will stop for about 5 minutes each morning to join in whole school prayer. It will begin with music, mindfulness meditation, the recital of our Advent Prayer, and conclude with personal prayer and reflection whilst music plays. Please be mindful of this if you are late to school, as everyone will be participating and you will be also asked to join in, or wait until the session is finished before engaging inconversation. Thank you.

ADVENT AT HOME

Just as we prepare our home for Christmas, we should also prepare our hearts. Why not have 'Advent Angels'? At the beginning of Advent each family member can blindly pick a name of another member of the family and become his or her Advent angel. Prayers, sacrifices and acts of kindness can be offered and exercised daily. During the Christmas season small homemade gifts can be exchanged between the 'angels'. This prolongs the joy of Christmas, encourages creativity and teaches children (and adults) to discover unique talents they can share with others.

3rd DECEMBER

This is the date that we ask parents and children **to wait** before bringing Christmas cards to share. (We can start bringing cards to school week of 10th of December.) We as a school are focusing on the Church season of Advent so we are encouraging children to acknowledge this as a time of waiting and preparing to celebrate Jesus' birth. It's a time to reflect upon Jesus' love at work in our own actions and in the world. We know it is difficult not to acknowledge Christmas with **soooo** much around that is already celebrating Christmas, but the waiting and preparing are important aspects of the Advent Season.

Is on **Friday** 7th December to celebrate the season of Advent - A time of preparation and waiting to commemorate the birth of Jesus. This will be at 2:05pm in the Multi Function Room led by our Student RE Team, just before assembly, all are warmly invited.

OUR FINAL WHOLE SCHOOL LITURGY will be on **Tuesday 18th December at 8:50am** in our MFR where we will gather as a school community in thanksgiving for the blessings of our 2018 school year. Again you are very warmly invited to attend.

The Juniors have now finished writing their parables and will begin learning about Advent, a time of waiting.


In Writing, students have begun learning about Persuasive Texts. They will form opinions and justify their reasoning.

MIDDLE UNIT

In Numeracy, Middle students continue to apply their knowledge when working with measurement. Students have been developing their knowledge and understanding of <u>MASS and CAPACITY</u> by using terms such as: grams, kilograms, litres, and millilitres. They have been estimating, hefting, weighing and discussing the weight of everyday items. Students will also explore volume and capacity, with students linking their learning about Mass, using hands on materials.

In Religion, students will begin to learn about Advent People. They will examine, where in the Bible we hear, see or sense the coming of Jesus? Students use the Christian understanding of Advent to plan actions to highlight and promote peace, hope, joy and love in their classroom, school environment and their own lives.

In Week 10, Middle students will have the opportunity to showcase their knowledge and understanding on Sustainability issues facing us in this modern world. Students have been researching and bringing together their understandings to teach others on a topic they are passionate about. Students will do this by holding a Middle Unit Expo, inviting family and friends to be involved in their learning.

Please encourage your child to take part in the Timezone Numeracy Challenge. Children will be able to access the question sheet in the office near the Timezone boxes. Please remind you child to show their working out and use efficient strategies to solve the problem. Make sure your child has written their name and grade at the top of the page before placing this into the box. The next two winners will be announced at the whole school assembly on **Friday**, 7th **December** and get to enjoy 30 minutes of free play at Timezone in Werribee!

Students will have until <u>3:30pm</u> on Wednesday, 5th December to complete and hand in the problem into the Timezone Numeracy Challenge box located near the office.

The question for the students to solve is:

Foundation-2 question:

Show **one half** in as many different ways as you can. You can use shapes, objects, number line, one half of a collection or any way that you like.

Grade 3-6 question:

I need to share 6 chocolate bars equally between 8 friends. How might I do this? Give 2 different options. What fraction of a bar does each friend get? Label your fractions.

Please encourage your child to login to Essential Assessment to practise the skills that they need to work on. Students also have access to the program Sunset Maths to practise the four operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, as well as money. To login, students use the same username and password that they use for their school Google accounts. The school code is: **CCPSW3030**. If you have any questions about Essential Assessment, please come and see me.

Also encourage your child (if they are in Grades 3, 4, 5 or 6) to login to Mfacts to practise their multiplication facts. Your child has the option of completing the *online practise questions* or the *self-directed learning* for the level that they are at. There are also excellent strategy videos that show you how to learn the different multiplication facts.
