## **Learning & Teaching News**



#### **GOODBYE TO 2018**



The end of our school year is rapidly approaching and for all of us it is a busy time of the year. Many students can become over tired and a bit cranky with social and school events happening over the next few weeks as Christmas approaches. It is important to keep as regular a schedule as possible. Late nights and eating larger meals than usual can lead to upset tummies and headaches in the morning.

For parents, these last few weeks before the end of term can feel like a marathon while trying to keep children's enthusiasm for learning alive and doing everything the Christmas season wants of you. Here are some ideas you can do at home to keep your children motivated in the classroom through to the end of the school year.

Have some time outside after school now that the weather is getting warmer and we have more daylight. Have dinner outside or a picnic in a park.. This will help children sleep better after a school day

- Time in the classroom is valuable right up to the last day of the school year and teachers are working hard to keep students busy and learning during the final weeks of school. Parents and carers can help them out by making a concerted effort to get your child talking about that learning at home. Avoid the impulse to focus on upcoming summer activities or indulge in complaints, and ask your child about what the day's learning included. As always, show interest in those topics because enthusiasm for learning is infectious
- For students, each school year is a different experience. As the school year is wrapping up, make it a priority to help your child reflect on all that he or she has learned and done in the classroom over the past nine months. Try having your child write a letter to their younger self from the start of the school year. What advice would they offer, what challenges can they expect, and what should they look forward to? This kind of reflection is a great way to get your child thinking about all the progress they have made throughout the year and motivate them to keep up the enthusiasm for learning
- Students could sit down with you and share their **Student Learning Journey and Report** with you explaining their work samples and what it shows about their learning.

### **Numeracy News**

Well done to all the children that had a go at answering the Timezone Numeracy Challenge question. The lucky winners that were announced at our whole school assembly on the 7th December were: Charlotte (Junior Padula) and Bridgette (Middle Drezga). Charlotte and Bridgette get to enjoy 30 minutes of free play at Timezone in Werribee!

That was the last Timezone Numeracy Challenge for the year. I would like to congratulate all the students that had a go at answering the questions. It was great to see the enthusiasm shown by the students and the great mathematical thinking that went into working out the problems.

I would like to wish all families a safe and Merry Christmas. Thank you for all the hard work and dedication you have shown this year in supporting your child with their learning in Numeracy. I encourage all parents to continue to support your child over the Christmas holiday break with developing their Numeracy skills and understanding. The teachers find that some of the students can go backwards with their learning from the end of school this year to the beginning of the next school year. Below are some suggested activities you can do to support your child's learning in Numeracy over the holiday break.

- Encourage your child to login to Essential Assessment to practise the skills that they need to work on. Students also have access to the program Sunset Maths to practise the four operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, as well as money. Just a reminder that the school code is: CCPSW3030 and the student's username and password is the same as their school login
- If your child is in Year 3-6, encourage them to login to Mfacts to practise their multiplication facts. Your child has the option of completing the *online practise questions* or the *self-directed learning* for the level that they are at. There are also excellent strategy videos that show you how to learn the different multiplication facts.
- Play board games like Junior Monopoly. It is amazing all the Numeracy involved in many board games!
- Use Lego and building blocks to make different shapes and objects
- If your child is in Foundation or Juniors, Orchard Toys have some excellent, fun games that involve many Math skills and concepts
- Involve your child in cooking and get them to use their measurement skills
- Bring fractions into everyday cooking using the language of half and quarters
- Encourage your child to work out the cost of items and the change you will receive when shopping
- Ask your child to read and tell the time on digital and analogue clocks throughout the day






#### Senior Spence's "retreat day" Kindness Project

I can't wait to hear all about it! See you in 2019. God bless!


