## **LEARNING & TEACHING NEWS**

### NAPLAN - GRADE 3 & 5 STUDENTS 2019

Dear Parents and Carers,

This year all children in year three and five at Corpus Christi will sit the NAPLAN tests online for the first time.

The tests consist of : Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy all of which will be completed online with the exception of the Year 3 Writing test that will be completed on paper as in previous years.

Instead of the one week test window we will now have a two week window for the testing to be completed as shown in the table below.

If your child is away at some time during the testing weeks they are able to complete *Catch Up* tests only within these two weeks.

Once the testing window is closed we are unable to do any **Catch Up** tests.

Note: Writing catch up tests need to be finalised by Friday the 17th May and may not be done in the second week of testing.

## **LEARNING & TEACHING NEWS**

We have had a very busy term with a lot of excellent learning and teaching in Numeracy. It has been very pleasing to see the children showing a Growth Mindset towards their learning and taking on challenges. As we enter the holiday break, please involve your child in everyday mathematics at every opportunity that you have. Here are some examples of tasks you could set for your child:

- Get your child to count forwards and backwards from different numbers. For example, starting at 23 get your child to count forwards to 50 then backwards to 38
- Give your child a number and get them to break up the number in many different ways. For example, 134 could be broken up into 100+34 or 110+24 or 50+50+34
- While shopping, work out what two or more items would cost. Get your child to estimate first and then ask how they worked it out? Is there another way you could work it out? Which way was more efficient? Get your child to work out the change that you would receive back if you gave a \$5, \$10, \$20 or \$50 note.
- Play board games like Monopoly and different card games like Memory and Go Fish. It is amazing how much Maths is involved in these games and it is fun!
- Using dice or playing cards, get students to add, subtract, multiply or divide the numbers. Get your child to explain how they worked it out? Is there another way you could work it out? Which way was more efficient?
- Ask your child to read the time at different times throughout the day (use analogue and digital clocks). How do you correctly say the time? For example, 2:35 is 25 to 3 and 4:30 is half past 4

### SENIOR UNIT NEWS....

Congratulations to all Senior students that have displayed their knowledge, understanding and new learnings about Lent and the events of Easter to different audiences. ### MIDDLE UNIT NEWS....

The last few weeks, the Middle Unit students finished off their unit on Reconciliation. We explored the story of Zacchaeus. We looked at the different stages of reconciliation in a relationship: admitting wrong; saving sorry; being forgiven; making up (being reconciled). The students also celebrated a mass led by by Father Albert where he was able to congratulate each reconciliation student and presented them with a certificate. We will be moving into our unit of Easter and Lent – A Journey of Hope until, the end of the term.

In Mathematics, the students have been learning about the different strategies for adding and subtracting numbers. They have learnt about the split, jump and compensation strategy and when to use the most efficient strategy to solve a problem.

In Writing, the students are learning about the persuasive genre of writing. They are learning how to create a text using persuasive features and how to use them effectively and convincingly.

### JUNIOR UNIT NEWS....

I can't believe it is nearly the end of Term 1. In Numeracy students have been working very hard on investigating numbers and looking at Chance, the likelihood of something happening.

Next term the Juniors will begin addition using efficient strategies to solve problems. Encourage your child to use mental strategies such as doubling, doubling add 1, make ten, number facts to 20.

In Religion students have been learning about the events that happened in Holy Week. Next Term after Easter, students will learn and listen to stories about Jesus' resurrection.

Students have been engaged in their Journal Writing on Monday mornings, writing about special events in sequential order using past tense words. This will continue into next term.







# The messages all boys need to hear

Research has shown that parents treat their boys and girls differently right from infancy.

For example, infant boys are touched more frequently and handled more roughly before the age of three months. Also physical punishment is applied more significantly for boys than girls in many Western countries. This is despite the fact that research also shows boys are more vulnerable and fragile.

Why do we do this?

The stereotypical belief that the only way to get boys to do the right thing is by shaming them, hurting them or being hard on them needs to be challenged every day because it is so deeply embedded into our society's psychology. The scars this creates in early childhood fester deep inside and are often the source of future irrational rage and aggression.

This does not mean we do not discipline our boys or make them accountable for their choices and mistakes. It means we need to consciously choose the same warm discipline and communication that we tend to use around girls. We need to take much better care of our little boys — emotionally, psychologically, physically and socially. We need to stop shouting at them, hitting them, shaming them and speaking harshly to them ("Grow up!", "Be a man", "What's wrong with you?").

#### Communication for resilience building

We need to make it acceptable for boys and men to express feelings other than anger and this starts with how we speak to them day-to-day.

A good (generalised) example is how some people might respond if a child falls over. When a boy falls, he may be told by someone influenced by the old code: "You're right mate, up you get." A girl who's fallen on the other hand may be greeted with: "Oh no sweetheart, are you OK? Come here. Let me make it better." And offered a cuddle.

My issue with either approach is that neither child is being offered the opportunity to build resilience. The boy is being told he mustn't feel anything and not to take pause at all — just get up and move on. The girl is being disempowered as it's assumed she cannot pick herself up and brush herself off, but rather she needs help to bounce back from this hurdle. A more resilience-building response may be to say to either child: "Oops, you fell over. Are you ok or do you need my help?"

It's a subtle difference in communication but the message our children get is that we expect that they are capable, their feelings are welcome (but not dictated to them) and we are here for them if they need us.

#### The trouble with boys

It seems when it comes to getting in trouble that our boys fare much worse than our girls. One reason for this may be because boys seem to be naturally more impulsive than girls from a young age and this can lead to them being poor decision-makers.

Michael Gurian, author of Saving Our Sons (Gurian Institute Press, 2017), writes about how males and females tend to process emotion differently in the brain. He writes that males tend to move emotions very quickly from their brains into their bodies. They also tend to sense the emotion but then shift it to areas of the brain that will work to solve the problem causing the emotion.

Females, on the other hand, tend to quickly shift emotions into the brain's limbic system and to the 'word centres' of the brain. This could explain why many girls — not all, but a significant proportion — will tend to 'talk it out' when they have an issue but boys may be more likely to spring into action, and have a physical response, hurting someone or something in the process.

It is our responsibility to help our sons realise that they need to respect those around them when they are making these decisions.

A good starting point is for every family to implement the 'three rules': 1. try not to hurt yourself; 2. try not to hurt others; and 3. try not to damage things in the world around you ... this sets an expectation for everyone in the household.

### Finally, when boys muck up...

- Try to see the world through his eyes and practise responding, not just reacting.
- Allow him time to cool down and process the situation.
- Gently ask what was his intention?
- Help with work out which of the three rules he broke and what other choices he might have made.
- Forgive him for making a poor choice.
- Reassure him you still love him 'showing' rather than 'saying'.

Above all, our boys need us (especially we mums) to be firm, fair and fun, and to reassure them we love them unconditionally — no matter what poor choice they may have made.
