UNIFORMS

I wish to congratulate children and parents on how wonderful our children look in their full school uniforms as they come to school each day. Uniforms provide children with a sense of pride in their school and a genuine sense of belonging to the school community.

Children were required to be in full winter school uniform from Monday 20th May, including black school shoes (black runners are not acceptable as replacements for black school shoes), grey socks and long grey pants for boys and navy tights/socks and tunics for girls. Students can only wear runners and white sport socks with their sports uniform. A navy blue rain jacket is available from Rushford's for the winter months if required. Also, please encourage children to wear a warm jacket or parker to school during the colder months to use during outside times if they need.

SECOND HAND UNIFORM

Any donations of Second Hand Uniform Winter items, particularly boys' grey pants and girls' tunics, would be greatly appreciated. Our 2nd hand uniform shop operates from 8:30am to 9:00am every Friday morning and is kindly run and organised by Mrs Susie Panhorst.

As a matter of courtesy and respect we remind all parents and carers to not park in private driveways or on the nature strips of our school neighbours.

Learning Community News

MIDDLE UNIT NEWS....

The Middle Community have been very busy so far this term. The children have already started planning and researching a South American country. They have shown a lot of enthusiasm so far.

In Numeracy, Middle students have been learning about Time using analogue and digital clocks. The children have just started learning about multiplication and have started using Mfacts to develop their multiplication skills and fluency with their multiplication facts.

Children have just finished learning about persuasive writing and have been working on writing their own persuasive texts using prompts such as 'Dogs Are Better Then Cats.'

We are continuing to work on reading workshop groups each week and the students are working on specific comprehension skills that they need to develop. Our focus in the next few weeks will be on non-fiction texts.

We encourage parents to assist your child in bringing their diary every day and checking their diary week-ly.

FOUNDATION UNIT NEWS....

Wow what an amazing first half of Term 2 we have had in Foundation. The students have been working hard in all areas of the curriculum whilst displaying a real love for learning. It has been great to see the students very enthusiastic about their take home books.

In Literacy, we have started our guided reading workshops. We have been looking at different strategies to help us read and practising how to read to ourselves and to a partner. They have been developing their knowledge and skills in reading by showing us what they know in small reading groups.

In Maths, the students have been looking at teen numbers and what they look like as a collection. We have been using MAB blocks and bundles of 10 to show that the '1' in a teens number represents 10. We then count the 'ones' by counting on.

In Wellbeing, we have been focussing on our emotions and what they look like. We started our unit by watching 'Inside Out' and discussing the emotions they saw in the movie. At home you can prompt your children to talk about their emotions by discussing what this emotion looks like and why they are feeling this way.

Our Inquiry unit 'How does your garden grow' is well underway. The children participated in a full day immersion where they learnt about how the seasons impact our weather, living and non-living things, basic needs such as water, air, shelter and food as well as exploring in the garden to see what we could find. We will continue this unit throughout the term during our investigations.

We would like to thank all the families for their support and attendance at our Prayer in Pyjamas night in week 2. The students did a marvelous job singing the songs and participating in our activities.

Just a reminder that our Term 2 overview has been displayed at the front of our communities, please take a look to see what we will be covering this term.

Please continue to read with your children each night and get them to identify the sight words in their take home books.

Learning Community News

SENIOR UNIT NEWS....

During the first half of Term Two, the Senior Teal Community has been very busy exploring and comparing the size of fractions and decimals. Many students were very proud of the learning that occurred when creating their own fraction wall with challenges of measuring and folding equal parts. Confirmation preparation is well under way as students defined the Holy Spirit and investigated the gifts and fruit of the Spirit that will be strengthened during the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Book Clubs that were introduced at the end of Term One are resulting in some great reading and conversation about a text. Students are growing in confidence to take notes to highlight aspects of a book, character and setting to being to discussions. These note taking skills were transferred to collecting information about different stages of the lifespan during inquiry workshops.

Our Inquiry workshops will begin to investigate over the next few weeks many physical, emotional, social and spiritual changes for adolescents during puberty for both males and females. Year 6 Confirmation Candidates will explore the life and gifts of the Holy Spirit displayed by their chosen Saint and participate in a reflection day to assist in being mentally, physically and spiritually ready for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Mathematics workshops on time, fractions and angles will keep students very busy. Congratulations to our Year 5 students that were positive in how they managed themselves during the NAPLAN testing period.

JUNIOR UNIT NEWS....

I can't believe we are halfway through Term 2. The Junior students have been deep into learning with engaging discovery activities integrated with Inquiry. This allows students to choose an area of interest which they want to showcase their learning and allowing them to work in different groups. Students have been engaged with the community gardens, designing and creating things through arts and craft, lego and shapes.

In Writing, students have been writing about their discoveries and have been learning about Information Reports. Students have been learning about the features and structure of a good information report. In the next few weeks, students will go through the writing process to draft, edit, revise and publish their work.

In Numeracy students have been learning about properties of 2D and 3D shapes. Ask your child to name some different shapes in the house. Next week we will begin to look at location; using words to describe where something is and how to get to places. Our workshops have been very busy learning about addition. Students have been learning different strategies to add and using efficient strategies such as doubles plus 1, make 10, partitioning and the jump strategy. In the next few weeks, we will begin subtraction and learn efficient strategies to subtract.

In Religion, this term we have been learning about Pentecost and the Holy Spirit. Students have learnt about the gifts and symbols of the Holy Spirit in the lead up to Confirmation. Next week we will begin learning about how the Church is Our Family.

REPORTING TO PARENTS 2019

Corpus Christi has undergone many changes in Administration and we thank you for your patience while we have gone through this process.

One of the changes is the format and contents of Corpus Christi reports of Student Achievement to parents.

Earlier this week parents and carers received notification about Corpus Christi Parent Portal. Through the portal, you will be able to access Student Achievement Reports and will have the ability to make Parent Teacher Child Learning Conversation appointments with your child's Home Group teacher.

The Student Achievement Report contains scores for student achievements in relevant Learning Areas and Capabilities including Religious Education / Education in Faith. The report also contains a Teacher Comment, with work habit scales of achievement in Effort and Class Behaviour.

Reports will be available from the Friday 14th June at approximately 4:30 pm

NCCD Information Sheet for Parents, Carers and Guardians

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) On School Students with Disability

What is the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data?

Schools must now complete the *Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)* every year. It counts the number of students who receive additional adjustments or "help" at school because of a disability. The NCCD helps governments plan for the needs of students with disability.

Who is counted in the data collection?

To count a student in the NCCD, schools must think through some key questions:

- 1. Is the student getting help at school so that they can take part in education on the same basis as other students?
- 2. Is the help given because of a disability? The word 'disability' comes from the <u>Disability</u> <u>Discrimination Act 1992</u> (DDA) and it can include many students.
- 3. Has the school talked to you or your child about the help that they provide?
- 4. Has the school kept records about the help they provide, the student needs and the reasons that the student needs this help? The school will need to keep copies of tests, student work, assessments, records of meetings, medical reports or other paperwork and information about how the student's learning is moving along over time.

Once the school decides that the student should be counted in the NCCD, they then choose a disability group and one of four levels of help that has been given to the student.

What does the word 'disability' mean in the NCCD?

In the NCCD the word 'disability' comes from the <u>Disability Discrimination Act 1992</u> (DDA). There are four types of disability that the school can choose from: sensory, cognitive, social-emotional and physical.

Many students that need help at school can be counted in the NCCD. For example, students with learning problems, e.g. specific learning disability or reading difficulty (sometimes called dyslexia), health problems (e.g. epilepsy or diabetes), physical disability (e.g. cerebral palsy), vision/hearing loss and social-emotional problems (e.g. selective mutism, Autism Spectrum Disorder, anxiety).

Letters from doctors or specialists can be very helpful for schools as they plan how to support students with their learning. Schools do not need to have these letters before they can count a

student in NCCD. Teachers can use all that they know about the student's learning and the records that they have collected over time to decide if a student can be counted in the NCCD.

What sort of help does the school give students?

Students need different types of help at school. Some students need a little help sometimes while other students need a lot of help nearly all the time. The type of help given depends on the needs of the student. The help can include changes to the school buildings or grounds (e.g. ramps or things like special desks or chairs), extra teacher help in classes, special learning programs, changes to the work they give the student or extra adult help.

How will the NCCD be different this year?

All schools have been counting students in the NCCD since 2015. The government will use the NCCD data as part of the funding to schools.

What will the school need to know about my child for the NCCD?

Schools work together with families to understand the needs of each child. It is helpful if families give their child's teacher a copy of any letters or reports they have. The letters or reports will help the school understand the child and the help that they might need. Letters from doctors, psychologists, speech pathologists, doctor, and occupational therapists etc. can be very helpful for schools. These reports along with information that the teacher has (i.e. school based tests, your child's work and learning plans) helps the school to understand and meet your child's needs.

What happens to the NCCD data? Who will have the NCCD information?

Each school principal must check the NCCD data in August of each year. The school will give the information to the Catholic Education Office. The school will work with the Catholic Education Office to make sure that the NCCD data is OK before they give the data to the government. The government will not be given the names of any students or any letters or records. Please ask your school for their privacy policy if you need to know more.

Does the school need me to agree with them about counting my child in the NCCD?

Amendments were made to the <u>Australian Education Act 2013</u> and <u>Australian Education Regulation 2013</u>). Schools do not need you to agree to let them count a child in the NCCD. You cannot ask the school not to count your child.
