

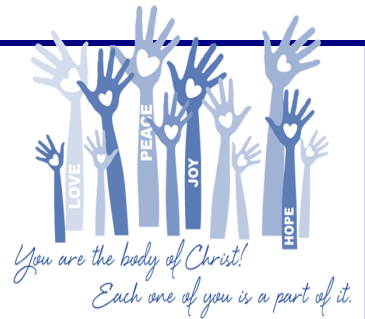

Learning Community News

MIDDLE UNIT NEWS....

The Middle Community have enjoyed planning and researching a South American country throughout this term. On Wednesday 19th June, the students had a chance to showcase what they had learnt about South America to other students and teachers in the Middle Community.

In Numeracy, Middle students have been learning about multiplication and have looked at different ways to solve multiplication problems such as using distributive property. Students are continuing to use Mfacts to develop their multiplication skills and fluency. We have also been learning about different types of shapes, angles and lines such as perpendicular and parallel lines.

Students have been learning about information reports and have been involved in writing some information reports, making sure they follow the correct structure.

We are continuing to work on reading workshop groups each week and the students are working on specific comprehension skills that they need to develop.

We encourage parents to assist your child in bringing their diary every day and checking their diary weekly.

FOUNDATION UNIT NEWS....

Wow what a busy term we have had in Foundation. The Foundation students this term were lucky enough to attend an Art excursion to support our Inquiry unit. The children hopped on a bus to The Royal Botanical Gardens and what an adventure we had. Besides the downpour, the children participated in a range of activities such as collage making that involved patterns, painting, leaf rubbings and an exploration of the gardens. We are so proud of the students willingness to join in and their behaviour throughout the day. They were great representatives of the Corpus Christi Community.

In Maths, we have been learning how we can collect information, this is called data. The students have been exploring questions such as what is the most popular eye colour in our class? and what is your favourite animal? We then analysed the data we collected and put that information onto a graph. From there we were able to see what was the most and least popular choices.

In Religion, we have been discussing the importance of our school house colours and the meaning behind the names we have selected. We have learnt that Mary Mackillop is very special to us because it was her idea alongside Father Tenison Woods, to start building schools for children.

In Literacy, we have continued our guided reading groups where we have been learning different strategies to help us decode unknown words in a text. Please continue to read with your child over the holidays so they can practise using different reading strategies for unknown words.

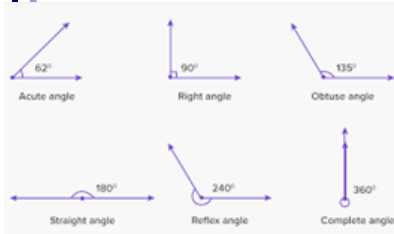
Learning Community News

SENIOR UNIT NEWS....

We have continued to have a very busy and productive Term Two. Students have been busy working to criteria to complete different stages of their 'Puberty Survival Kit'. We look forward to hearing the many presentations that display growth and change over time. During Religion, we have taken our experiences and knowledge of the Sacrament of Confirmation into exploring past and present examples of Discipleship in our world. We have used this to plan how we can act like Disciples in our world today.

Our Wellbeing Workshops have been a great success as students build their bank of strategies to make friends, deal with stress, be positive, manage their social filter, explore being confident and effective ways to manage peer pressure. They have also expanded their awareness of being smart, safe cybercitizens along with ways to be safe and manage themselves around drugs.

Our first round of Book Clubs will come to an end with many students celebrating finishing a book, being involved in discussions, comparing & contrasting events and characters along with developing inferring comprehension skills. We plan to begin a new book club rotation at the beginning of Term Three. Students have already started to use their students voice to suggest new books and make choices based of covers, burb, students' reflections and areas of interest.



We look forward to ending our last week of Term Two as we finishing exploring some Mathematical concepts of angles, shapes along with fractions, decimals and percentages. These concepts will continue to make some appearances in our learning as the year progresses and we make links to all areas of Mathematics.

JUNIOR UNIT NEWS....

It has been a busy term for the Juniors. It is great to see students positive and engaging with their learning.

In Inquiry, students have been doing rotations with each teacher to learn about different parts of the environment such as plants, mini beasts, bees and the water cycle. From their sessions, students have used all the information they have learnt and have written Information Reports with labelled diagrams. Students are in the process of publishing their reports.

In Religion students have been learning about the Church and how;

- Sunday is the Church's day of gathering
- All people can be people of God
- The parish looks after and cares for one another
- God acts and speaks through the Church



Next Term the **Junior Prayer night will be in Week 2 on Tuesday the 23rd July**. Students will be looking at the different schools in St. Andrew's Parish and how the Parish help the community.

In Mathematics, students have been learning about subtraction strategies such as counting up, counting back, using fact families, linking subtraction with addition and using place value to subtract. Continue to ask your child to count backwards and solve subtraction problems. We also have been using the bee bots and using Google Earth to learn about location and giving directions.

In Wellbeing, students have engaged in rotations with the Junior Teachers to learn about the importance of honesty, kindness, playing fairly and strategies to stay calm. Ask your child about some of the exciting things they have been doing in Wellbeing.

Numeracy News

Thank you to everyone that attended the Family Numeracy Night. I hope you walked away from the evening with some useful information and activities that you can use with your child/children at home. Thank you to all the staff that assisted on the night in making it such a successful evening.

Some of the main points discussed at the Family Numeracy Night were:

- Explore **one problem many ways** NOT **many problems one way**
- Understanding how to use **efficient** (*quick and easy*) strategies is important
- Students begin learning by using **concrete materials** such as counters. Then they move to the **semi concrete / pictorial stage** of drawing pictures/diagrams to solve problems and eventually they advance to the **abstract stage** where they can work out problems in their head.
- Only use the written algorithm strategy (borrowing and carrying) when students understand other strategies and can add and subtract 2 digit numbers in their head
- When teaching place value, present numbers and discuss their full value: **104** as: **ten tens and four ones** or **one hundred and four ones** or **104 ones**
- Work on ten more and ten less such as ten less than 601
- Use concrete materials such as bundling sticks and 100 dot cards to teach place value
- Answers do not involve exchanging units. For example, students solve 195 and ten more is 205, but don't need to explain this by trading 10 tens for 1 hundred
- The aim in teaching place value is to cultivate strong mental strategies
- Focus on the process, not the end result - encourage and praise your child for their working out and persistence
- If your child is having trouble working out a problem ask if there is another way they can work it out
- Don't tell your child that they are smart or clever at Maths - if they make a mistake they will think they are not smart anymore
- Research has found that positive parent emotions lead to positive student emotions, and positive student emotions are connected to better performance
- When students believe that everybody's ability can grow, their achievement improves significantly

Here are some effective questions you could ask your child when they arrive home from school:

- What did you discover today?
- What did you find challenging? What would you do differently next time?
- How did you work it out? (Strategy used)
- Why did you do it that way?
- Is there another way? Which strategy was more efficient?
- Did you see or hear another strategy that was efficient?
- How has your thinking changed?

Foundation excursion to the Royal Botanical Gardens

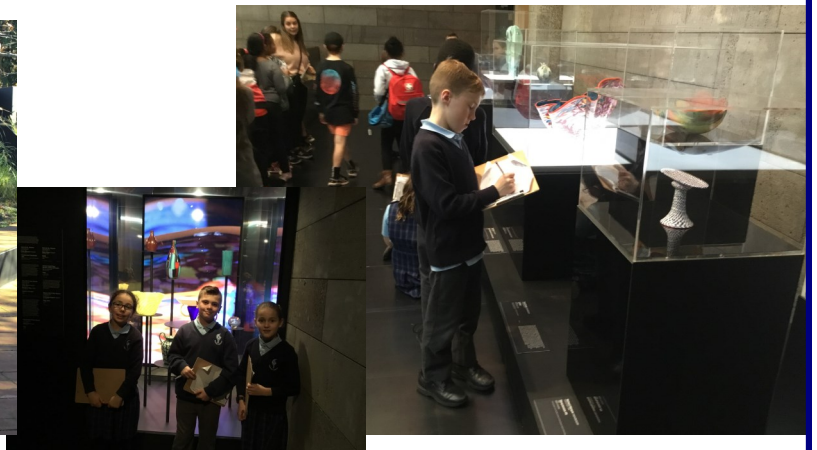

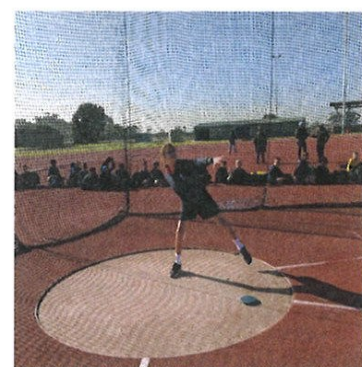
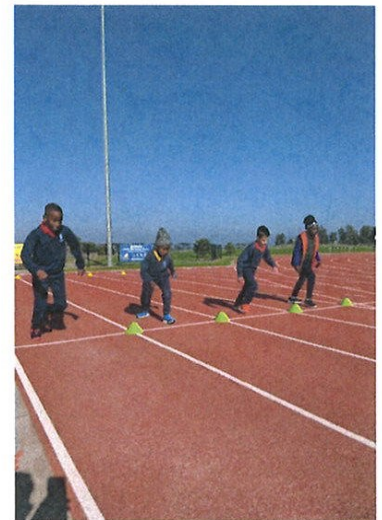

NEW PARISH SCHOOL IN ST ANDREW'S PARISH

You may be aware that we are building a new Parish Primary School in the Parish of St Andrew's – taking us up to 6 primary schools! Please find following a message from Fr Albert regarding our new school in the Harpley Estate which is scheduled to open in 2021.

Dear Friends,

Good day to you. As you all are aware that we are in the process of building a new primary school for the parish of St. Andrew's in the Harpley Estate. The school will be opened in 2021. We invited the parishioners to propose a name for our school name and then again to vote for their preferred name out of four names proposed - St. Luke, Galilee, St. John Paul II & St. Joseph.

It was wonderful to see 425 people participated in the voting and 195 of them voted for St. Joseph in honour of the Sisters of St. Joseph who had been pioneers in the parish, St. Andrew's school & MacKillop College.

The wish of the people was sent to the Arch Bishop for his approval and as the Arch Bishop is away in Rome the Vicar General has given us the approval.

So I am pleased to convey the glad news to you that our new school in Harpley Estate will be called ' St. Joseph's Catholic Primary School'.

I will be announcing this in our parish this weekend and you may let your children and their families know via the school newsletter or other means next week.
