# Welcome Back

It is with sadness that we begin this year aware of the enormous suffering of thousands of our fellow Australians. The beginning of 2020 has been marked with loss, destruction, separation and deep sadness due to the devastating fire situation so close to us particularly in the Gippsland areas, but also in our bordering states of NSW and South Australia. If you have been effected or have family or friends who have been effected please know that our thoughts and prayers are with you and all who are currently struggling as a result. I can only imagine the grief and heartache of the people who have been a part of this disaster over the last few weeks.

Into these communities too, have come hundreds of volunteers and service organisations who have given up their own family celebrations, and placed their lives on the line to bring help, support and relief where possible. Demonstrations of the spirit of generosity and support has truly been evident in so many varied and amazing ways.

We too, as a Corpus Christi community will offer our full support for what may be required. We understand that the effects of such trauma will be felt for many months and even years to come.

Therefore we will look to a multi-pronged response that will continue to support current and emerging needs of those effected.

Some of the ways to support include:

Archbishop Peter Comensoli, through the Catholic Education Office has strongly encouraged us to direct any donations to the St Vincent de Paul Bushfire Appeal: https://donate.vinnies.org.au/appeals-vic/vinnies-nsw-bushfire-appeal-vic to ensure that our brothers and sisters have a chance to rebuild their lives after such devastation.

Raising funds for the St Vincent's Bushfire Appeal is certainly one way that we can demonstrate in "action" the call of Christ to reach out to those in need.

Our own St Andrew's Parish have had special collections for the St Vincent de Paul Bushfire Appeal and the Youth of our Parish held events to raise funds for the appeal as well.

The following information and links have been provided by our local CFA to support communities in being able to rebuild their lives after such devastation.

"Donations of food and clothing have been generously given by the greater community, however charitable organisations are inundated and have requested that any further donations should be by way of financial means.

This will go directly to the fire affected communities / organisations who are in desperate need of support and assistance.

Another idea may include planning school camps in the fire effected communities to help support the local economy over the next few years. This may not be feasible for the school (given the distance to travel), however, encouraging families to spend their holidays in those locations would be great."

We are considering possible opportunities to link with schools that have been effected and provide both financial and emotional support. We have been advised by the Department of Education's Student and Wellbeing Branch that support in this way would be better left to a time further down the track when they are better placed to cope with offers of reaching out.

May I encourage you to speak with your child, listen to their questions and concerns and then explore ideas that we, as a school, can "respond through action" to help those in need now and in the future. Children are encouraged to share these ideas with their classmates and teachers.

Thank you for your support in this very important effort to bring Jesus' message of service to others in our world, in a very meaningful authentic way.

### COMMUNICATION

At Corpus Christi we believe that strong family-school partnerships improve student motivation and learning. #### **SPECIALISTS AREAS 2020**

# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

# CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

UCATION

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

#### **HOW TO APPLY**

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

# Update regarding Coronavirus Outbreak

Further to my message last week, I am writing to provide you with updated advice about the novel coronavirus outbreak relating to people arriving in Australia from mainland China.

Any child returning from mainland China (not including Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan) who was in mainland China on or after 1 February 2020 is to be isolated at home and should not attend school until 14 days after they were last in mainland China.

This recommendation applies only to children who were in mainland China on or after 1 February 2020. It does not apply to students that left mainland China before 1 February 2020.

As previously advised, parents of students that have been exposed to a confirmed coronavirus case or that have arrived in Australia from Hubei Province should ensure that their child is isolated at home and does not attend school for 14 days. An updated factsheet provided by the Victorian Government providing advice and information about the novel coronavirus was also sent to families.

The well-being of your child continues to be of paramount importance to me and our school staff. I will continue to share information and advice about the coronavirus outbreak as it becomes available.

### **IMPORTANT - SUPERVISION AFTER SCHOOL**

From 3:05pm until 3:30pm please remember that for safety reasons no child is allowed on the SENIOR PLAYGROUND, BASKETBALL COURT or the OVAL after school without the DIRECT supervision of parents from 3.05 – 3.30pm. In addition, toddlers and pre-schoolers may use the JUNIOR PLAYGROUND only with DIRECT supervision of parents at all times.

#### SUPERVISION AFTER SCHOOL FROM 3.30pm

Also, we ask that all families who are still onsite after 3:30pm to move to the front grassed area of our school to continue to play or wait for siblings. This is in order to enhance the safety and supervision of children in the care of the Out of School Hours Care Program staff. At this time they move from the MFR and use the playgrounds and oval with the children enrolled in their program. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

#### Volunteer requirements

Under current legislation, it is a requirement that all volunteers provide the following information:

- Display your current Working With Children Check card
- Read and sign our 'Volunteer Code of Conduct' (copies available from school office)
- Attend a "Parent Helper session" if you wish to help in the classroom

Whilst undertaking volunteer roles, you must also:

- Make the importance of Child Safety a priority at all times
- Minimise risk of child abuse
- Follow school procedures
- Respond to and report concerns to school staff

# Making new friends and staying in touch with old classmates



As a parent there is a great deal you can do to help your child adjust socially at the start of the school year. Here are some tips to help.

#### Encourage your child to be open to new friendships

An open, friendly attitude is a child or young person's best social asset. Students who open to forming new friendships are more likely to succeed than those who seek solitude, who are critical and who limit themselves to just one or two familiar faces. Encourage your child or young person to seek out new friendships, even though they may feel uncomfortable or strange at first.

#### **Encourage healthy relationships**

Do all you can to encourage healthy relationships based on respect and common courtesy. Generally, when a relationship is healthy a child feels safe, valued and able to speak up. Unhealthy relationships, such as cliques, are restrictive, one-sided and are full of gossip and criticism.

#### **Encourage inclusiveness**

Studies have shown inclusiveness to be one of the prime social skills shared by socially successful students. Encourage your child or young person to include others in games, conversations, team activities and other group activities. Inclusiveness is not just a wonderful friendship skill, it's strong leadership attribute as well.

#### **Encourage friendships with both genders**

If you are in a co-education environment encourage your child to form friendships with both boys and girls. This is particularly valid if your child has siblings of their own gender, or don't have siblings. It's through these early relationships that we gain the confidence to mix with different genders in the later years. Forming friends across genders helps to break down the mystique that sometimes forms, when a child has little contact with the 'other' gender.

#### Stay in touch with former classmates and school friends

Encourage your child to maintain friendships with former classmates and groups outside of school as this helps to insulate against unfriendly behaviour that they may experience with their close social circle.

#### **Provide social scripts**

Your child may benefit from being provided with some social scripts that they can use in common social situations such as meeting a new friend, joining in a game or asking someone else for help. Boys, in particular, can benefit when given the words to use in a variety of different social situations.

#### Forming new friendships can take time

Meeting new students and forming new friendships can be anxiety-inducing. If this is the case for your child, then it helps to acknowledge their feelings of discomfort, but also remind them that these feelings will pass. As well discuss the fact that feeling comfortable with new friends often takes time, particularly if your child by nature is reserved or slow to warm up in social situations.

Helping kids work through friendships can be tricky for a parent as you don't have a great deal of control over what happens at school. However, with empathy, patience, encouragement and a supportive attitude you can do a great deal to help your child make a smooth social transition.
