



Australian Childhood Immunisation Register

A national register that records vaccinations given to children under seven years of age.

Your child's immunisation history can help you

It is important to keep your child's most recent immunisation history statement so you can use it when proof of immunisation is needed.

For example, you can use your child's statement to:

- help meet immunisation requirements for school enrolment
- help keep track of your child's immunisations

The Australian Childhood Immunisation Register records a child's immunisation history and provides an immunisation history statement to their parent or guardian.

This statement can be used by parents and guardians to help them keep track of their child's immunisations and as proof of immunisation for childcare and school enrolments.

Immunisation history statements are only available online or at a DHS Service Centre if your child is under 14 years of age. Call the Immunisation Register if your child is 14 years or older.

Note: the Immunisation Register only records vaccinations given from 1 January 1996 to children up to seven years of age.
