# **HOME GROUPINGS 2021**

Over the last few weeks, the staff have been discussing ways to support students with the transition back to school. One of the ways we feel that we can ensure some consistency and security for students after such an unsettling year is to maintain the same mix of students in classes for 2021 as far as this is possible. Therefore, we are planning for most Grade One, Grade 3 and Grade Five students to remain in the same Home Group as they were in this year. This allows for much needed continuity, stability and consistency that we believe is vital after a year as the one we have just had.

Our Home groups did not have the opportunity to be together as a group for a large part of this year and as mentioned above it would minimise the amount of disruption to the children in home groups and provide some familiarity for students moving into 2021. However, there will need to be some minor changes for things such as balancing grade numbers but this will be kept to a minimum.

# **SENIOR CAMP**

Due to restrictions being lifted and Regional areas being opened to the people of Melbourne, we are anticipating that our **Senior Camp will be able to be held in December**. We will notify families as soon as all details have been confirmed.

# **Foundation 2021 Transition Sessions**

Our Foundation 2021 children will be visiting our school in small groups during the next few weeks and will be able to meet some teachers and have a tour of our school.

Given the current restrictions that are in place we have needed to modify the way would undertake additional aspects of our Transition Program to support our children and families. Changes include the production of a **Welcome Video, Information Packs** and the conducting of **Parent Zoom Sessions.** 

### **WELCOME VIDEO**

Our Foundation staff team are producing a welcome video that will introduce each staff member and include a tour of some of the areas the children will be using at school, in order to familiarize them with our school setting a little further. The video will be made available via email and will also be placed on our website during the week beginning 7<sup>th</sup> December.

### PARENT ZOOM MEETINGS

Given we are unable to schedule a face to face meeting we are organizing 'zoom' meetings for parents of children in Foundation 2021.

I will be sending Foundation 2021 families a link for a Zoom meeting where they will have an opportunity to meet some staff members and ask questions regarding transition and the beginning of the 2021 school year.

For **EXISTING** families with children already at school, we will have two sessions on

Thursday 19th November at: 9.30am and 6.00pm.

Please feel free to join either session as a link for both sessions will be sent to you.

For **NEW families** to the school with their first child, we will have two sessions on

Thursday 19th November at: 10.30am and 7.00pm.

Please feel free to join either session as a link for both sessions will be sent to you.

## FOUNDATION "INFORMATION PACKS"

Please also know that information we feel is helpful regarding your child's Transition to school, will be provided in the coming weeks via email or hardcopy at the transition session or may even be sent via the postal service.

# **BEGINNING of 2021 - FOUNDATION**

We will continue our Transition and Orientation program as we begin 2021.

Foundation students will be allocated into two groups for their **Orientation** – Group A and Group B. Half of each group will begin on either Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> January or Friday 29<sup>th</sup> January, where they will spend a half day at school.

Families will be notified of their allocated group as soon as the groupings are finalized. Children will all begin together on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> February in their home groups for half a day. Children will begin full days on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> February. The children will remain home for the first five Wednesdays during Term One. This will enable Family Conversations and Assessments to occur on these days.

### FAMILY CONVERSATION and ASSESSMENT 2021- FOUNDATION

Foundation 2021 families will be asked to nominate an hour's session during one of the 5 Wednesdays. At this session their family can meet with the home group teacher for the first half hour and then the teacher will use the second half hour to complete some individual assessments with your child. Sign up details for these conversations and assessment hours will be communicated to families on the Orientation days.

# FAMILY CONVERSATIONS and ASSESSMENTS 2021- Grades 1-6

Given restrictions related to Covid, we are redesigning our beginning of the year processes regarding Family Conversations. More details regarding our Grade 1 to Grade 6 children's return to school will be provided as soon as possible.

# **GOVERNANCE OF CATHOLIC SCHOOLS 2021**

From the beginning of 2021 Governance arrangements for schools owned by the Archdiocese and its parishes will change. A new company called 'Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools Ltd (MACS) will take responsibility for governing and operating the schools. Similar Governance arrangements have been in place in other dioceses in Australia for some time, but now the Melbourne Archdiocese will take on board these new arrangements. The civil governance will be undertaken by a Company with a Board where the directors are appointed by the Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne as the members of the Company. While the change in governance will not disrupt the work of schools, it is important to keep teachers, parents and staff informed about this new situation. The change in governance arrangements will see all 293 schools owned by the Archdiocese in the Archdiocese of Melbourne in 2021 transferred to MACS, which will be responsible for the governance and operation of the schools.

With legislative and compliance requirements rapidly becoming more complex for our schools, a governance model based on one person (namely Parish Priest) in which the school is unincorporated, as currently found in our parish schools and regional colleges is no longer viable. Consequently, the new governance model seeks both to ease the administrative burden on our schools and parishes, and to allow the parish priest more time to focus on not only being an important supporter of the local Catholic school but to have some more time for numerous other priorities as well.

What makes our particular school a Catholic school and not an independent or a government school will still be emphasized and the Parish Priest at this time will not be spending any significantly less time in sharing viewpoints with the Principal, Leadership Team and Religious Education Leader. The Parish Priest will still be a member of the School Advisory Council but not technically Chair anymore. The school will remain a part of the missionary outreach of our Catholic Parish but it is also important that parents of children of other faith traditions will continue to be more than welcome as we try to support the formation of the whole person. As far as most parents are concerned there will be little foreseeable change and the new governance reforms should enable schools to continue delivering an outstanding faith and values-based education, without being burdened by the increasingly complex legislative and regulatory requirements.

This new model will also continue to help us receive the necessary funding from both the Victorian and Federal Governments as we pursue a more professional course.

Our current School Board members have worked with CEM personnel this year regarding the Governance changes which will take place from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2021 in their endeavour to be as informed and knowledgeable of the process as possible. Many aspects of the changes that will be taking place are still being determined and these will be communicated to schools in an ongoing way as we approach the end of the year and move into 2021.

As no members will be retiring from the School Board this year, all current members will become our inaugural "School Advisory Council" members for 2021, under the new Governance model.

# SCHOOL UNIFORM

# SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMS

Due to COVID Restrictions the Parish has been unable to celebrate First Holy Communion with our Year 4 students this year nor the Sacrament of Confirmation with our Grade 6 children. With significant restrictions still in place for Religious gatherings, the Parish is currently unable to confirm specific dates on which Sacraments will be celebrated in 2021. Corpus Christi in conjunction with the Parish will communicate Sacramental details with families, once government restrictions are suitably eased.

# FIRST EUCHARIST

Once restrictions are suitably eased, the Parish will recommence its Sacramental Programs. Corpus Christi will hold **First Eucharist celebrations next year for our 2021 Year 4 & Year 5 students**. The date of this sacrament will hopefully be confirmed at the beginning of next year.

# **CONFIRMATION**

Students currently in Year 6, will be invited to receive the Sacrament next year. The Parish will work with MacKillop College and Thomas Carr College, to organise this. If your child is not attending a Catholic Secondary College in 2021, please keep in contact with the Parish Office for details regarding the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation.



# **Foundation Unit News**

This term we have been learning how Jesus is our friend and explored the scripture story of how Jesus called his disciples-'friends', and that we are Jesus disciples too. Through reading Factual texts and Fairy tales we reinforced our reading as well as our writing conventions focusing upon the story's setting, characters and the story sequence.

During our Mathematics units of subtraction, money, sharing and time sequence, we looked at everyday situations that use these concepts.

A special time for our unit this term is exploring NAIDOC week, where one of staff members Miss Clarke will be a guest speaker. A Foundation student, Preston will also tell us about his digeridoo and show us how it is played.

It is hard to believe we are nearing the completion of our 2020 school year.

We thank everyone who has helped us and cared for us this year.

# **Junior Unit News**


Term Four is well and truly into the swing of things in the Junior Unit!

We have started straight back into our Reading Workshops with a big focus on inferencing and reading between the lines. We have become detectives and look for clues within a text, film or image and use our prior knowledge to make meaning.

In Mathematics we have been learning to tell the time. We know that an analogue clock has an hour and a minute hand and we can count by 5's to see how many minutes have passed. Students made their own clocks and have been using them to demonstrate half past, quarter to and quarter past. We are moving into our Multiplication Unit this week!

Our "Scientist For a Day" was fun and exciting for everyone! The students have continued their learning since then by conducting experiments about sinking and floating. We designed our own boat out of plasticine and tested whether they would float or sink!

# **Middle Unit News**

In the Middle Unit, we have been learning about vulnerable, threatened, endangered and extinct animals. Students composed information reports detailing the classification, diet, habitat and other interesting facts of these animals They are currently in the process of preparing for an Inquiry Expo in Week 8. Students will be presenting their research using different media.

In Mathematics, the students have been looking at Fractions of shapes, length and a collection. We also conducted surveys gathering data and presenting them on a tally and a graph. We have also analysed the data by writing statements about our observations.

In Literacy, the students have been engaged in different reading workshops and independent activities. We have been focusing on cause and effect as well as literal and inferential comprehension.


# **Senior Unit News**

This term, we welcomed back our students from Remote Learning. We would personally like to thank and congratulate all of our families for their effort and commitment throughout this time. We understand that it has been extremely difficult for our students and our families and are thankful for the work that was completed at home. It was fantastic seeing the students return, socialising with their friends and engaging in conversation.

The last couple of weeks for this term, the seniors have been working on a range of different understandings and uses of fractions. Students have investigated addition and subtraction of fractions with the same and different denominators, looked at the size of fractions, compared and ordered fractions as well as creating fractions in a range of different ways. Moving forward, students will continue to investigate fractions as well as their relationships with decimals and percentages.

In Literacy, students will continue to look at persuasive devices used in advertising. Students have investigated companies, logos, slogans, colours, fonts, ads and billboards. With this new found knowledge of persuasive techniques, students have looked at creating their own company logos, slogans and billboards to advertise their own company.

In Inquiry, students have investigated a range of different investigations throughout time, including historic like the wheel and modern day inventions like the internet. Students looked at the impact that these inventions have had on individuals, the economy and the environment and worked in groups to discuss the positive and negative impacts of a variety of inventions. Moving forward, students will begin to investigate the design process to begin designing their own invention.




# **Second Hand Uniform**












# ONLINE WORKSHOP VICTORIA
