## **STAFF NEWS**

I wish to inform our school community that two staff members will be on extended leave in the coming weeks. Mrs Helen Drezga will be on leave from Monday  $31^{st}$  May and will return to us at the start of Term 3. ## **NAPLAN**

During the past two weeks our Year 3 & 5 students completed the Naplan assessments. Naplan data is valid, as a 'snapshot' of a child's development at one point in time and is used alongside a large variety of data that teachers gather to effectively plan for the needs of students.

The tests consist of Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy all of which were completed online with the exception of the Year 3 Writing test that was completed on paper as in previous years.

Results of the Naplan assessments are due in late Term 3. These are then forwarded to parents when they arrive.


Please also ask children to be very alert to traffic conditions while walking or crossing roads and driveways.

## **LEARNING AND TEACHING**

## Reading with your Child at Home

Sharing a book with a child is fun! It's a time for closeness, laughing and talking together and it can also give children a flying start in life and help them become lifelong readers.

If you're not feeling confident about reading aloud or sharing books, don't worry, there is no right or wrong way to do this!

#### Reading with young children

The books that children bring home to read, should be at a slightly lower level than what they are reading in the classroom. It is meant to be an enjoyable experience for both parents and their children. Not stressful!

#### Don't Tell Them, Guide Them

If you tell your child every word they get stuck on, they won't learn to use the reading strategies they are learning at school and will expect you to tell them every time. This isn't going to help them to develop and grow as readers.

#### Create daily opportunities to build your child's reading skills

By creating a print-rich environment at home. Seeing printed words (on posters, charts, books, labels etc.) enables children to see and apply connections between sounds and letter symbols.

#### When you're out and about

- Point out letters on posters, billboards and signs. In time you can model sounding out the letters to make words.
- Focus on the first letter in words. Ask your child "What sound is that letter?" "What other word starts with that sound?" "What word rhymes with that word?"

#### Reading with older children

Research has shown that it's actually beneficial to read to and with children even after they can read on their own. It shows that continued reading aloud after age 5 and well beyond improves reading and listening skills and academic performance.

- Let them have some say in the books you read together. Go to the library together to choose a book
- Use the books as conversation starters
- Allow the books to lead to other learning and provide time for special interests not just school provided literature
- Ensure that the reading time is a positive one by providing a quiet comfortable space or put a bean bag or corner of cushions in their bedroom
- Create a relaxing environment where distractions and noise area at a minimum
- Use audio books some of the time.Listening to a story is a skill in itself and enables children to hear new words without the difficulty of working them out
- Let them see your enthusiasm for reading no matter what it is!

## **FOUNDATION NEWS**

At the beginning of the term, we went on an excursion to the Queenscliff Marine and Freshwater Discovery centre. It was such an amazing learning experience. We went beachcombing and discovered many new things, such as sea urchins, shark eggs, sea sponges, cuttlefish bones, sea squirts and a variety of types of seaweed. At the Discovery centre we learnt about lots of different animals that live on the coast and in the bay. We saw animals such as, flathead, crabs, sea stars, gummy sharks and sea cucumbers. We even got to meet a very cheeky pufferfish. So much learning happened on this day. It has really been so special and has enhanced our learning back at school.

In Literacy, we have started our guided reading workshops. We have been looking at different strategies to help us read and practising how to read to ourselves and to a partner. They have been developing their knowledge and skills in reading by showing us what they know in small reading groups. We need to remember to;

- 1. Look at the pictures eagle eye
- 2. Look at the first letter of a word lips the fish
- 3. Stretch out letters and slide them back together stretchy the snake.



In Maths, the students have been looking at teen numbers and what they look like as a collection. We have been learning that teen numbers can be represented in different ways, such as number lines, tally marks and tens frames.

We would like to thank all the families for their support and attendance at our Prayer in Pyjamas night in week three. The students did a marvelous job at singing the songs and participating in our activities at our zoom meeting.




## **MIDDLE UNIT**

In the Middle Unit we have been engaged in various learning experiences. We are linking these experiences to our Inquiry unit on Natural Disasters.

In Mathematics, the students are exploring the topic of addition and subtraction. Students are learning a variety of strategies to solve equations like partitioning, doubling and the expanded columns strategy.

In Inquiry, we have been looking at natural disasters and how the changes in the Earth's systems impact how we need to sustain life for the future. We are also looking at the cause and effect of change within environment.

## Respectful Relationships focus — Problem Solving


Over the next few weeks, students will be learning about Problem Solving strategies through our Respectful Relationships wellbeing lessons. Students will be able to:

- · Recognise that everyone experiences problems from time to time
- Describe characteristics of cooperative behaviour
- Identify a range of conflict resolution strategies to obtain positive outcomes
- Describe and apply strategies that can be used in situations where they feel uncomfortable or unsafe.

#### Students will discuss:

- That problems happen all the time
- We can brainstorm options and solutions to work through problems
- Is this a **BIG** problem (elephant size) or is this a **small** problem (ant size)?
- Can I use a strategy to solve the problem or do I need to ask an adult for help?

Feel free to print and use our Problem Scale at home, too!

At school, we try to normalise all feelings. Key understandings we want all children to know:

- it's normal to worry and feel anxious sometimes
- our body feels anxious because it is trying to protect us from danger (even when there sometimes isn't any danger!)
- we can talk to our brain and use techniques to calm our body and brain.

If you feel your child is feeling anxious a lot of the time and it is affecting their daily life, please make an appointment to discuss with your Family Doctor.
