





# NAPLAN

NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM  
Literacy and Numeracy

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students are held in May each year. In 2022, NAPLAN Online test window is between Tuesday 10th May and Friday 20th May. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The results of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals and can be used to improve student achievement.

All students are expected to participate in the NAPLAN Online tests. Catch up tests will be available for individual students who are absent on test days up to and including Friday May 20 2022.

Support can be arranged for students with disabilities, if the student regularly uses similar support for classroom assessment tasks.

Exemptions may be granted to students with significant intellectual disabilities and to students who have been learning English for less than one year. If your child is eligible for support due to disability or exemption, you should discuss this with your child's classroom teacher as soon as possible. Parental consent is required before any support due to disability or exemption is granted.

Students may be withdrawn from NAPLAN by their parent or carer. This is a matter for consideration by parents and carers in consultation with myself or Mrs Roynic. If, after consultation, you decide to withdraw your child, you must sign a student withdrawal form. These forms will be made available early in Term 2.

Later in the year, you will receive your child's personal NAPLAN report. The report will describe your child's particular skills in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The report will also indicate how your child performed in relation to national minimum standards. These describe the minimum acceptable standards for students across Australia.

There is an opportunity for students to complete a practice test at home prior to NAPLAN that will allow them to view the platform and see the types of questions that may be included on the tests. Please [click here](#) to access the practice tests. These will be available until Friday April 22nd.

## **NEW SHADE STRUCTURE OVER BASKETBALL COURT**

***We are excited that our new Building Project – Shade Structure over the basketball court - will begin next week with an estimated completion date of mid June 2022.***

### **EDUCATIONAL BRIEF FOR THE STRUCTURE**

At Corpus Christi School, a strong emphasis is placed on the principles that support collaboration and communication between all members of the community, in order to assist in student learning.

Our project to build a shade structure over the basketball court supports the need to create a contemporary, flexible learning space that can accommodate current approaches to learning and teaching.

This outdoor learning space will provide learning and teaching opportunities as part of the curriculum but it will also enhance opportunities for creative engagement with the wider community which can promote student connectedness and wellbeing.

This structure will serve many educational purposes including:

- The provision of an outdoor gathering space for Whole School Assemblies
- The provision of an additional outdoor learning space for a variety of curriculum areas including, but not limited to, Physical Education, The Arts, Numeracy etc
- Protection from the elements including: sun, heat, rain

- The space covered by the Shade Structure will not only be a functional space but it will also enhance the aesthetics of the school.

The Project will obviously impact school routines for the next few months but I have every confidence that the outcome will be extremely worth it.

We begin next week with the installation of Temporary Fencing which will be erected on Thurs 7<sup>th</sup> April.

Our morning routine and dismissal routines will essentially remain very similar but with the **back basketball courts** replacing the main basketball court for play, line-ups and collection of students at the end of the day.

**Foundation** children and their siblings will continue to be picked up from the front grass area.

Children in **Grades 1-6** can be picked up from the back basketball court or outside the Junior portable classes.

**Russell Street walkers and bike riders** will continue to be dismissed from the Russell Street gate at 3.05pm.

**MacKillop Walkers** remain the same.

Children will continue to have access to the outside toilets and drinking fountains at all times.

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Both the Senior Playground and the Junior Playground will continue to be able to be enjoyed by the children as will the school oval.

Should any routines need to be adapted further as the project progresses I will certainly keep you informed.

***We look forward to beginning our project and we look forward to the benefits to the additional covered area that will be available as a result of this structure.***

## **LEARNING AND TEACHING**

### **LEARNING POWERS**

As a whole school this year we are working towards getting students to be more informed about what makes them successful learners. In the Foundation and Junior areas students have been exploring different Learning Powers. These Powers are what makes us successful with learning new skills and concepts. Having an understanding of these Powers helps students to identify what makes them unique as learners and even highlights opportunities of potential growth.

The Powers are categorised into eight areas: *Curiosity, Attention, Determination, Imagination, Thinking, Socialising, Refection, Organisation.*

In the Middle and Senior areas we have started to incorporate these Powers into our learning goals. This results in the students reflecting on their own outcomes based on these Powers and what they exhibited as

So far we have focussed on taking turns, staying curious, taking responsibility for our things and communicating respectfully. After Discovery, we share and write all about our learning experiences through personal recount writing, which includes a detailed picture.

In Numeracy, we have been using our new knowledge of numbers to play various games. This has also helped us develop our skills in cooperation, turn taking and encouraging others. We have also learnt about patterns and sorting objects into different groups.

Our Religion Unit has seen us explore Lent through our Lenten Action Tree, which helps us show that we have God in our hearts. We have also begun to explore the Holy Week stories leading up to Easter Sunday. We are looking forward to celebrating this very special time with our families during the holidays.

## JUNIOR NEWS



Term 1 has been incredibly busy for our wonderful Junior students!

On the 8th of March, all students participated in a very informative incursion run by the RACV. This supported students' learning of their Inquiry unit about Self, and how the choices they make impact themselves and others.

Fast forwarding to the 10th of March (that's right, just two days later!), our lucky Juniors went on an excursion to Dream City! Students were immediately immersed in various experiences; including podcasting, virtual reality, robotics, nursing and fire fighting. All activities provided opportunities for further development of persistence, curiosity, imagination and socialisation (these are just some of our Learning Powers!) On the way back to school, students commented on how fantastic the day was, as they did not do any learning! They were amazed to find out that this was not actually the case!

Thursday 10th also saw our Grade 1s attending their very first camp experience! Students participated in rotations including tower building, paper plane competitions and lots of dancing, followed by a delicious Grill'd dinner. It is safe to say that everyone slept well that night - teachers included!

In Literacy, students have been working hard to understand and include past tense verbs (e.g. slept, ran, played) and time connectives (first, next, finally) when speaking and writing. We welcome you to discuss these with your child when asking them about their learning experiences.

For the remainder of the term, students will continue to develop their understanding of recount writing, based on various experiences. They will also strengthen their understanding of comprehension strategies, including making predictions, connections and inferences when reading. Inferences are made when we connect clues from the text to what we already know (prior knowledge). For example, when our students eagerly run to their classroom in the morning with a smile on their face, we can infer that they are happy to come to school! Students will also extend their knowledge of place value, by reading, writing, ordering and manipulating two to three digit numbers.

We hope you enjoy discussing these exciting learning experiences with your children!



## MIDDLE NEWS

The middle unit students have settled in well into the routines and have adapted to the expectations in the Middle Community.

This term the Middles have been exploring healthy habits as part of our Inquiry unit. We were lucky enough to visit Velisha farms where we were given the opportunity to learn about the plant life cycle and had tours around the farm and production facilities. Throughout the day the children also participated in a range of activities from measuring our heart rates during physical exercise and rest times as well as focussing on our mental health through meditation.

Middles have also been participating in specialist rotations each fortnight that are run by the middle teachers. Our 5 rotations include Art, Sport, ICT, Social and Emotional Well-being. Students have responded very positively to these experiences each session as they are able to work with and get to know the middle unit teachers and gain new skills in a variety of areas.

A huge congratulations is extended to our Grade 3 students, who have celebrated their first Sacrament of Reconciliation. It was such a wonderful night at St Andrew's Parish Church as we were able to celebrate this milestone with students' loved ones. The Corpus Christi Community could not be prouder of the way our Reconciliation candidates conducted themselves on the night.

We are looking forward to Holy Week and remembering the journey of Jesus during this holy period in the church calendar year.


### GLOBAL EVENTS AND CHILD WELLBEING
