I wish to also thank all staff at Corpus Christi who supported the Confirmation Candidates and their teachers in so many ways throughout the program and at Mass on Thursday.

#### **NAPLAN**

Congratulations to all of our Yr 3 & Yr 5 students who have completed 2 weeks of NAPLAN assessments. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The results of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals and can be used to improve student achievement. Results will be provided to families later in the year.

Results of the Naplan assessments are due in late Term 3. These are then forwarded to parents when they arrive. Due to COVID-19 and other health related issues, the administration on NAPLAN testing over the past 2 weeks has been impacted by student and staff illness with some students unable to complete the NAPLAN testing within the prescribed test window.

There are specific contingencies in place to manage COVID impacts and the VCAA has consulted with ACARA on this issue.

In these circumstances, please be advised that NAPLAN online tests may now be administered, where this can be accommodated by the school, up to and including Friday, 27 May 2022.

#### **UNIFORMS**

I wish to congratulate children and parents on how wonderful our children look in their full school uniforms as they come to school each day. Uniforms provide children with a sense of pride in their school and a genuine sense of belonging to the school community.

Children are required to be in full winter school uniform from Monday 23rd May, including black school shoes (black runners are not acceptable as replacements for black school shoes), grey socks and long grey pants for boys and navy tights/socks and tunics for girls. Students can only wear runners and white sport socks with their sports uniform. A navy-blue rain jacket is available from Rushford's for the winter months if required. Also, please encourage children to wear a warm jacket or parker to school during the colder months to use during outside times if they need.

Bookings for these conversations will be able to be made through our Community Portal which will go live mid Term 2. Further details and instructions will be forwarded to all families as soon as possible.









#### **JUNIOR NEWS**

# ...And just like that, we are already at the halfway mark of Term 2!

Early this term, May from Wyndham City Council visited our Juniors to support their learning of sustainability. Students have eagerly been investigating waste, and the devastating journey litter takes. They will continue exploring the different properties of common materials, and ways to minimise our impact on the environment. Watch this space for an exciting upcoming experience for our kiddies!

There has been a lot of excitement in Junior classrooms this term, with yet another exciting guest... but this visitor has four legs and a tail! Murphy the therapy dog has been visiting Junior students and even listening to them read! Murphy has very quickly become a much loved member of the Corpus Christi community.

Reading lessons have also seen our students developing an understanding of non-fiction texts, in order to support their writing of information reports. Students have explored the features of non-fiction texts, such as specific facts, subheadings, labelled diagrams and photographs, and thoroughly enjoyed learning more about various animals in the process!

For the remainder of the term, students will continue learning about specific social skills, such as respect and positive ways to interact with others. They will use daily songs to help reflect on our relationship with God, and the lessons of kindness and compassion Jesus showed others. Wellbeing and Discovery sessions will provide opportunities for students to practice these skills, as well as extend their friendship circles. Students will also continue to learn about the connection between addition and subtraction, and how these concepts connect to real world situations.



#### **LEARNING & TEACHING**

Last term as a school we started to develop an understanding about different Learning Powers and how these powers help us to be stronger, more successful learners. In Term Two we are building on this with teachers and students focusing on what skills/concepts we need to exhibit to be successful within a lesson. To do this we ensure our lessons have an explicit learning goal. We call this a WALT (we are learning to). The students aim to complete the WALT within that lesson. To break the WALT down into smaller more manageable parts we use Success Criteria. These criteria assist students with understanding the required skills or steps needed to complete a WALT. These different criteria incorporate our Learning Powers and help students understand that learning is more than just completing a task.

The reason why we are working so hard on this area, is the positive impact it can have upon students' learning outcomes. Also, by ensuring our learning goals are targeted to different abilities it allows all students to experience success within their learning.

#### **FOUNDATION NEWS**

We have had a very smooth start to Term 2 in Foundation. Everyone seems to be well rested and ready to take on new challenges!

In Literacy, we have been looking at books that tie in with our Inquiry Unit about animals and the roles they play in our lives. So far we have looked at pets and zoo animals. Next, we are going to be learning about farm animals and we are so excited to be going to an actual farm for our excursion. We have been making 'animal journals' and have been adding to them each week.

In Numeracy, we have been focusing on teen numbers and different ways we can represent them. So far we have made a turkey with 11 feathers, a farm with 12 sheep, a giraffe with 13 spots and a giraffe with 14 stripes. We have also been learning to represent these numbers in tallies, on a number line, as words, in pictures, on tens frames, in towers of tens and ones and with our fingers. We have really enjoyed playing buzz to practice our counting too! We have begun our unit on data and have investigated different ways to collect and organise this data.




Our Religion Unit so far has continued to focus on Easter and how Jesus and his disciples reacted after his Resurrection. We will shortly be moving into the season of Pentecost. A prayers in pyjamas night has been organised for the 25th of May, via zoom. More information will be sent home next week.

#### MIDDLE NEWS

This term the Middles have been immersed into the inquiry topic about endangered, threatened and extinct animal species. They listened to a presentation, recorded information and generated questions and wonderings about various endangered animals. The purpose was to spark interest and curiosity about our Inquiry topic. As the term progresses we will explore how we can support and protect endangered animals?

In mathematics this term the Middles are exploring the connection between addition and subtraction. We are developing an understanding of the different strategies we can use, for example a number line and partitioning to solve equations and worded problems. As the term progresses we will be investigating transformation.





#### **SENIOR NEWS**

Term Two. Even though it is a short term this year we have achieved and worked on so much already.

The Seniors have delved into the world of "My Place" text. We have been exploring the history of Australia within a picture story book. This led us to an excursion to the Melbourne Immigration Museum. A wonderful and engaging experience in how Australia has developed into such a multicultural society.

In Maths, students have been investigating and practising a variety of multiplication strategies, including partitioning, the lattice and vertical algorithm strategies. In Religion, we have been working through the understandings of Confirmation and helping our Grade 6 students to prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation this week. Please keep these students in

your prayers as they confirm their faith. In the coming weeks, we will be exploring more of Australian history and creating timelines. We will continue to read the story and view episodes of the story of My Place. Students will compare the differences and similarities between the two. In writing, students will continue to look at the text "Ziba Came on a Boat" and explore the range of different sentence and text structures. This includes identifying nouns, verbs and adjectives to assist them in creating their own detailed sentences to create engaging texts.
