

NEW CHILD SAFE STANDARDS

Schools, as child safe organisations always have the best interests of children at heart.

The Child Safe Standards recognise that all children are vulnerable and they require schools to **take steps to prevent child abuse** and **build a culture of child safety.**

We cannot assume that child abuse does not and cannot happen within our schools or school communities. Therefore, Child Safe Standards matter and are SO important because they aim to keep every child safe and free from child abuse.

The New Child Safe Standards start 1 July 2022. On 1 July 2022, <u>Ministerial Order 1359</u> – the framework for child safety in schools, replaces Ministerial Order 870.

The **New Child Safe Standards** build on the current Standards, which were originally implemented in 2016, with changes and new requirements for organisations, including for schools to:

- involve families and communities in efforts to keep children and young people safe
- provide cultural safety for Aboriginal children and young people
- better manage the risk of child abuse in online environments
- ensure governance, systems and processes to keep children and young people safe are developed, documented, implemented and embedded

Corpus Christi School is well placed to address the requirements of the New Standards by building on our existing child safety strategies, policies and practices.

As a school we are currently updating our policies and reviewing our processes and procedures in light of the New Child Safe Standards. The updated policies will replace the current policies and we aim for them to be available on our website by 1st July.

We will keep our families informed of these updates and continue to involve families and the school community in our approach to child safety and wellbeing during next term and into the future in an ongoing way.

DROP - OFF, PICK - UP & PARKING Safety

Our morning drop-off routine is working extremely well, with parents / carers parking safely in designated parking bays before allowing children to exit the car and children entering the school independently. Thank you also for using Disabled Parking Bays **only** if you have been issued with a **PERMIT** to do so.

At Dismissal it is great to see so many children walking and riding or scootering out the Russell Street, Red gate. Many of these children walk/ride directly home while other children are met by parents / carers who have arranged to pick them up at a designated place in neighbouring streets. As well as providing extra exercise, the additional benefit has been a significant reduction of congestion in the carpark. We thank these families who have been in a position to organise this way of picking up their children.

We ask you however, to PLEASE remind children that if they are waiting for you to pick them up in neighbouring streets that that are respectful of property that they are near. Please ensure these areas remain litter free, that children do not enter driveways or front lawns, nor do they climb on fences or signposts.

Finally, please respect our neighbouring properties and residents by not parking across driveways. Thank you for your ongoing support and for keeping all members of our community safe!

LITERACY UPDATE

This term in the Middle and Senior areas of the school we have been experimenting with different teaching methods in the area of writing. We have been using rich picture story books to help students further develop their writing skills. The Middle students have been using the text: *Fox by Margaret Wild and the Senior students have been using: Ziba Came on a Book by Liz Lofthouse. Both of these texts are filled with amazing vocabulary and provide students with great examples of how to structure sentences in engaging and meaningful ways.*

Within this method our teachers have highlighted the crafts of these authors and supported students to imitate them. This has allowed students to use advanced sentence structuring techniques to produce short but meaningful texts.

This is an example of a Senior students writing:

The car stopped with a thud, she saw the grand gates of her new school that opened magnificently. Brielle got out of the car bitterly, it felt like reliving her previous school. As she watched the car drive off she felt a sudden surge of nervousness, she approached the gates hesitantly. Surveying the grounds with interest, she shuffled to her classroom repeating this to herself quietly. "I'm going to have no friends". "No" she thought, "Think positive". She tried to think positive, but this was no fairytale to overcome. Negative thoughts began to consume her brain like a thick misty cloud. A sudden spark rushed through her head reminding her of the all times she got humiliated in class because of her being graceless.

What an exciting few weeks we have had in Foundation! Our excursion to Animal Land Children's Farm was such a highlight, everyone had so much fun and we also learnt so much!

Our Inquiry Unit this Term has been all about animals and the roles they play in our lives. Our excursion was a fantastic way to see what we have been learning about through non-fiction texts in real life! We have been adding to our animal journals and cannot wait to showcase our progress.

In Numeracy, we have begun our unit on seasons and have started creating a 'seasons wheel' to show our understanding. We have explored teen numbers up to 20 and have continued to learn how to represent these numbers in a variety of ways. For the remainder of the term we will be consolidating what we have learnt through games and other activities.

The Prayers in Pyjamas Night was a huge success. It was so nice to come together with our families and share some special moments with God. On Peace Day we celebrated as a whole Foundation Unit and created beautiful artwork that displayed what peace meant to us - keep an eye out for our whole school display! We are really looking forward to Corpus Christi Feast Day and all of the fun activities that have been planned.

In the final weeks of Term 2, we will be having some very special visitors 'hatching' into our community - stay tuned for the update!



JUNIOR NEWS

As part of our Inquiry unit. all Junior students braced the wintery conditions for a visit to CERES Community Environment Park!

Students participated in three valuable rotations throughout the day. The activities included an insight into composting and the opportunity to create our own compost, a walk along Merri Creek to observe the impact of litter on our waterways, as well as the opportunity to make their own piece of paper out of 100% recycled materials - this activity was a favourite for nearly all students! Our Juniors also learned about the 6 R's and their importance in protecting our environment - Rethink, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Rot. Your child may even be able to show you their dance actions for each one!

The day also provided many opportunities for language development, which students eagerly described in a recount text upon their return to school.

After the past two years of learning in lockdown, it has been an absolute joy to provide a range of external, hands-on activities for our students so far this year.

We thank you for all of your support in your child's learning this Semester and wish all families a blessed and restful holiday break.



MIDDLE NEWS

This term in Literacy, the Middles have been learning about writers craft. We have been studying the text Fox, and learning how to write like Margaret Wild. We did a wonderful Rich Assessment Task which allowed us to show our understanding of writers craft, imitating the text and illustration through art. Our unit on snapshot writing gave us the opportunity to further develop our own personal writers craft. In Reading, we have been exploring the difference between fiction and non-fiction texts, and further developing our skill of inferencing and predicting.

In Numeracy, we have continued to build our number sense by exploring subtraction. We are developing a variety of different strategies to help us solve subtraction problems. We are also looking forward to learning more about graphing.



SENIOR NEWS

Wow, oh wow! We can't believe it is near the end of the first semester of the year. We have been very busy bees in deed. We have been buzzing like bees in many different cooperative groups this term. Group work has been a major focus this term. We have been following cooperative protocols; such as taking a turn in sharing ideas and understandings, being at equal eye level for all group members and being an active listener.

In Literacy, we have finished analysing and critiquing the historical picture story - My Place. We explored all the language and text features of Nadia Wheatley's text. During the last couple of weeks of this term we will use all these language and text features to create our very own double page spread of either the years 2018 or 2028. This has been a very exciting project.

In Maths, we have been exploring different multiplication strategies and now using this knowledge to apply to division strategies. Ask your child about the links multiplication has with division. We also have been exploring the concepts of volume and capacity. Ask your child the differences between capacity and volume.

Planning for next term has already begun. We will be exploring text, media and language features through visual media (a movie). Fractions and decimals will be a major focus next term in number, as well as collecting and analysing data through statistics and probability. We will also explore the different types of governments as well as how local, state and federal governments perform for our Australian Democracy.

ITALIAN NEWS

PASTA MAKING SESSIONS MIDDLE COMMUNITY

As part of this semester's Italian unit 'Il Cibo' the Middle 3/4 Community students have been learning about traditional Italian foods from various parts of Italy. As part of this unit, the children have had the opportunity to make their own pasta during their Italian sessions and take their pasta home to cook and eat. Students had an enjoyable time making the pasta and learning how to use a pasta machine. Many thanks goes to the LSOs, Mrs. Pacifici and Miss Foster, for their valuable assistance during the pasta making sessions. Positive Coping lessons have a focus on self talk which contributes to resilience development and an understanding of how to self-calm.
