DROP-OFF, PICK-UP, and PARKING Safety

Our morning drop-off routine is working extremely well, with parents / carers parking safely in designated parking bays before allowing children to exit the car and children are entering the school independently. Thank you also for using Disabled Parking Bays **only** if you have been issued with a **PERMIT** to do so.

PLEASE also ensure you only park in designated parking bays and not illegally on pavements and centre strips.

At Dismissal it is great to see so many children walking and riding or scootering out the Russell Street, Red gate. Many of these children walk/ride directly home while other children are met by parents / carers who have arranged to pick them up at a designated place in neighbouring streets. As well as providing extra exercise, the additional benefit has been a significant reduction of congestion in the carpark. We thank these families who have been in a position to organise this way of picking up their children.

NAPLAN INFORMATION



This year NAPLAN will occur between **Wednesday the 15th of March and Friday the 17th of March** for the Year 3 & 5 students. There will be catch up sessions held during the following week for students that missed certain assessments.

NAPLAN assessments can cause some stress with students and families and we believe that by sending a consistent message across our community we can relieve some of these stresses.

NAPLAN gives us a snapshot of where we are as a school at a certain period in time and although we value this data we value our student wellbeing more. We encourage students to try their best and we as teachers explain the purpose of the assessment and how it is important from a whole cohort point of view and not on a student to student basis. We also encourage students to see it as an opportunity to challenge their learning in a different method to what they normally would.

We wish our Foundation families a warm welcome and congratulate all of the children on such a successful first few weeks of school. The children have adjusted well to the new routines at school and continue to explore their roles and responsibilities as community members in Foundation, as well as students at Corpus Christi.

In the first few weeks of term, we have been learning our Stage 1 letters and sounds (m, s, f a, p, t and i). We have been enjoying the Milo's Birthday Surprise storybook, meeting a new character and sound regularly. We have also been learning about the how we read books by investigating the front cover, eg. the title and the illustration. We learnt about full stops and that we need to stop and take a breath when we see them in a text.

In Numeracy, we have been learning about the numbers from 0 to 10. We have also been learning to correctly write the digits 0 to 9. Our buddies joined us for a Maths lesson and helped us make a dog to represent the number 4, as dogs have 4 feet. We have been listening to stories and singing lots of songs to learn about the days of the week.

We sang and prayed together at our Beginning of Year Whole School Mass and as a Foundation Unit we came together to learn about and celebrate Ash Wednesday. During these celebrations we were able to put into practice what we have learnt about prayer and the sign of the cross.

LITERACY

This year in Literacy we are incorporating rich and mentor texts into our learning. By using these texts we are able to analyse and develop a deep understanding of the author's craft.

In Writing, we use mentor texts to learn about how authors have formed and created different sentences. Students will then experiment by manipulating and patterning the written sentences in different ways. This in turn, encourages them to be more creative with the craft of their own writing. Some of the text we have been using in writing across the school are: *Jetty Jumping (Juniors), Dog Lost (Middles) & Girl on Wire (Seniors)*

In Reading, we have been using the rich texts: After The Fall (Middles) & Hoot (Seniors). By using these texts we have been able to get students thinking far more comprehensively about the settings, characters and plot. This has helped develop those strategic actions of reading that helps us understand and interpret the information embedded in text.
