



# **FOUNDATION NEWS**

It is hard to believe that we have almost finished one term of school! Time flies when you are having fun! One of the favourite things we love to do in Foundation is Discovery. Discovery is a time when students are empowered to make decisions about their own learning. They choose the learning they want to engage in, who they do this with, and where they do it. We would like to take this opportunity to once again thank the 'Learning Helpers' we have been fortunate enough to have joined us during Discovery, it is very much appreciated!



For the remainder of the term we will be moving into the next stage of our 'Little Learners Love Literacy' program and meet some more characters from 'Milo's Birthday Surprise'. We have been learning to blend the sounds we already know together to read and form words. This has given the students a great sense of achievement and leaves them (and us teachers) feeling very proud!

In Numeracy, we have now learnt about all of the numbers up to 10. We have been very busy learning to represent these numbers in a variety of ways. For the rest of the term, we will be consolidating what we have learnt by engaging in games and other hands-on learning activities.

Our Inquiry and Wellbeing lessons have given us the opportunity to explore how we have changed over time and celebrate our uniquenesses, talents and skills. We had so much fun guessing each other's baby photos!

We have some exciting experiences planned for next term, including our very first excursion! Stay tuned for more details to come soon.

# JUNIOR NEWS

Term 1 has been incredibly busy for our wonderful Junior students!

In Literacy, students have engaged in a range of quality texts, to support their development of comprehension strategies, vocabulary and writing skills. One of the texts used in Writing and Inquiry, was 'Rodney Loses It!'. In this text, Rodney the rabbit experiences a range of emotions, as he deals with the loss of his favourite pen. Students were able to connect this text to the Zones of Regulation, as well as use it as a basis to write a retell. Students were supported in their Writing lessons to develop their understanding and usage of appropriate time connectives, punctuation, adjectives and adverbs.

Spelling lessons have seen our students further extending their phonemic awareness, through activities involving the manipulation of phonemes (sounds). Students have utilised their knowledge of consonants and vowels, to manipulate a range of CVC, CVCC and CCVC words. For example, if we take the word 'clash' and remove the /c/, we can replace this initial sound with /f/ to make the word 'flash'.



There are several exciting experiences coming up for our Junior students, as we get closer to Term 2! In the meantime, we are eager to share in the first camp experience for our Grade 1s, with their Grill'd dinner and activity afternoon rapidly approaching!

On the 8th of March, the Grade 3 students celebrated their First Reconciliation at St Andrews Parish Church. In Numeracy, we have been exploring the concept of Place Value. The children have been learning how to represent 3, 4 and 5 digit numbers in a variety of ways. For example, partitioning and expanding our number, placing our number in a place value house, using MAB's to visually represent our numbers and many more. It has been fantastic to see the children grow in confidence when challenging themselves with larger numbers.

The children have enjoyed learning about the events of Holy Week. The Grade 4 students have researched and created presentations about the days leading up to Easter. They then shared this knowledge to their Grade 3 peers. This was a wonderful way to work with others and boost engagement.
