CREATING AUTONOMOUS LEARNERS AT CORPUS CHRISTI

A big focus for us as educators is to support students in their development and involvement in their own learning in engaging and meaningful methods. One of the cornerstones of learners' engagement is for students to have ownership within the learning process.

Something we have worked very hard to achieve here at Corpus Christi is to ensure students are not only aware of how learning occurs but are also part of the procedures, structures and processes we use here. We want students to be aware of our teaching approaches. We want students to know and understand their role in our Whole School Instructional Model. We want students to be contributing to and joining in the learning, not just witnessing it.

These are some examples of ways we are promoting students to be more autonomous with their learning:

Calify Environment The second and case The second	This is our Whole School Instructional Model that is vis- ible and constantly referred to by the teacher. This pro- vides Senior students with the visual support to under- stand how our lessons are structured.
	This visual display from a Middle classroom shows the focus for groups of students that are trying to improve aspects of their writing. Underneath the names (crossed out) there are words that students have used in their own writing and then added them to the display.
	This photo shows Junior students conducting Read to Self. Within this time students get to choose a text from their book box. These book boxes are filled with texts by the student with the support of the teacher. There are some texts that are targeted for that particular student's reading level and there are texts that they have brought from home or chosen from the library. By having a vari- ety of texts students practise taught reading strategies while also having the opportunity to read texts they are interested in.
	This photo shows Foundation students co-creating the Success Criteria (learning goals) with the teacher. This shared responsibility ensures that the students are aware of what they are required to do to be successful with a particular learning task.

These are just a few examples of the ways we are supporting students to become more aware and involved within their own learning. We put a huge importance on student voice and agency and as a school we are always trying to find ways to embed these factors into our classroom practice.

FOUNDATION NEWS

We have hit the ground running this term and have begun our journey of becoming marine biologists! Our excursion to the Point Lonsdale rockpools and the Marine Discovery Centre in Queenscliff has opened our eyes to the wonderful marine creatures that we will be learning about this term. We have created marine biologist journals and will be adding to them over the term. Towards the end of the term there will be an opportunity for families to come in and view these journals, as well as another exciting creation!

"On our excursion we went to Queenscliff and we went to the beach. We got to touch lots of things like sea snails, crabs, sea sponges and we even got to taste sea lettuce! It tasted like a rotten cucumber! We found lots of different coloured seaweed. Then we got back on the bus and went to the aquarium. At the aquarium we learnt about sea creatures and we got to see the sea horses being fed. There was a touch tank and I touched a sea urchin and shark shells. Mr Taylor got a bite on the thumb from a hermit crab! We went back on the double decker bus and came back to school. I loved all of the excursion."

In Numeracy, we have begun learning about teen numbers. We have been representing these numbers by making jelly fish with 12 legs and fish tanks containing 13 fish, for example. We have started our unit of measurement and will learn about using different forms of informal measurement to measure things in our environment.

We participated in an Inform & Empower session and learnt about screen time and green time and why it is important to balance the two. In Wellbeing we have been exploring our emotions even further and have also learnt about positive self talk and why we should believe in ourselves.

Our Religious Education Unit has involved exploring the Bible and the different stories it contains. So far

we have learnt about the Creation Story, Noah's Ark and Joseph the Dreamer. We are looking forward to exploring the Bible and its stories even more.

JUNIOR NEWS

On the 4th of May all Junior students participated in an incredible incursion, run by the team at Wild Action. Students were able to get up close and personal with a range of Australian animals, including a shingleback lizard, short necked turtle, boobook owl, joey and a (baby!) freshwater crocodile. This incursion helped students' delve into the Tuning In aspect of our new Inquiry unit, Amazing Australian Animals.

In Literacy, students have been continuing to extend their comprehension skills, using the text 'The Paw Thing' by Paul Jennings. Students have been consolidating their ability to visualise and make logical predictions, as well as infer character traits and feelings. Ask your child to explain why the main character, the cat, is named 'Singenpoo' - it certainly gave us all a good laugh!

In Maths, students have been exploring various addition strategies, including mental computation of number bonds (friends of ten, doubles, near doubles) and partitioning numbers using place value. Juniors have investigated these concepts using a range of games, such as the Bunny Ears game, to improve their automaticity. They are also continuing to investigate data in real world situations.

Over the next few weeks, we will continue reading 'The Paw Thing', and are eager to see what kind of mischief Singenpoo, Mac and Scott get up to next! Students will also continue researching their Australian animal of choice, whilst developing inquiry skills, such as researching, questioning and collaborating with others. We look forward to sharing our learning with you soon!



MIDDLE NEWS

The Middles have had a fantastic beginning to Term 2. It has already been a busy few weeks filled with excitement from excursions, incursions and new learning.

NGV:

On Friday 5th May, students visited the National Gallery of Victoria for their Art and Italian excursion. They had the opportunity to explore a range of pieces in the Viva Italia exhibition, a nature journaling experience in the Gallery Garden and to explore the gallery on a self-guided tour. It was a fantastic day! We extend our gratitude to Mrs Larissa Murdock and Mrs Ada Parrella for organising this opportunity in the Middle Unit.

Werribee Zoo:

In Inquiry, students had been preparing for their excursion to the Werribee Zoo. By using Digital Technologies, students used resources such as the Werribee Zoo website to explore the grounds map, some social stories and videos such as the Safari tour.

Balanced Kids:

In Wellbeing, Middle students have been fortunate enough to participate in the program 'Balanced Kids' with Jane Johnston every Wednesday. This program supports the emotional wellbeing of our students through mind-body understanding, creativity, balance, coordination, storytelling, interactive play, adventure, games, meditation, focus, mindfulness, breathwork and calming relaxation. So far, students have shared that they are using some strategies that they learn in this program at home, and look forward to 'switching off their brains' in each session.

Runt:

In Reading, Middles have been reading a new whole class text called 'Runt' by Craig Silvey. The students have immersed in the story plot and are enjoying the rich, ambitious language that is used within the text. We are looking forward to continuing this text throughout the term!













In Literacy, we have been developing a deeper understanding of the elements of visual texts. 'Happy Feet Two' the movie has been our vessel of learning.




We have explored different character traits and plots/subplots of the story. We have discovered that music plays an important role within visual texts.

history of Antarctica. Thank you Dr. Rodney Facwett for sharing your expertise.


In Maths, measurement has been our focus. We have been working on converting between measurements such as centimetres Converting LENGTH Units
